Being a district affected by left-wing extremism, the project's prime objective was to bring the faith of the people back in the schooling system.

Each week she would take home a couple of books from the library. She would then proceed to read them whenever she could. She would also read to her younger sister and parents.

Reading had become a part of Krishna's life. School was no longer a dreary place for Krishna and the routine of classroom lessons was interspersed with much enjoyed moments in the library. Her academic performance also improved. For the Rabari family the changes were beyond expectations and for Vikrambhai, his hope has been rekindled. 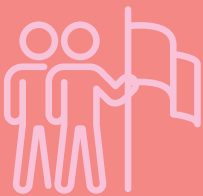
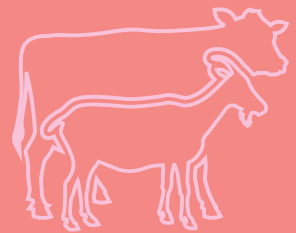
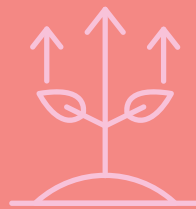
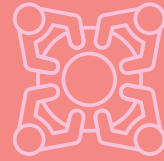
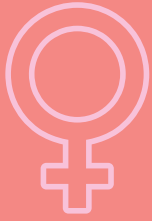


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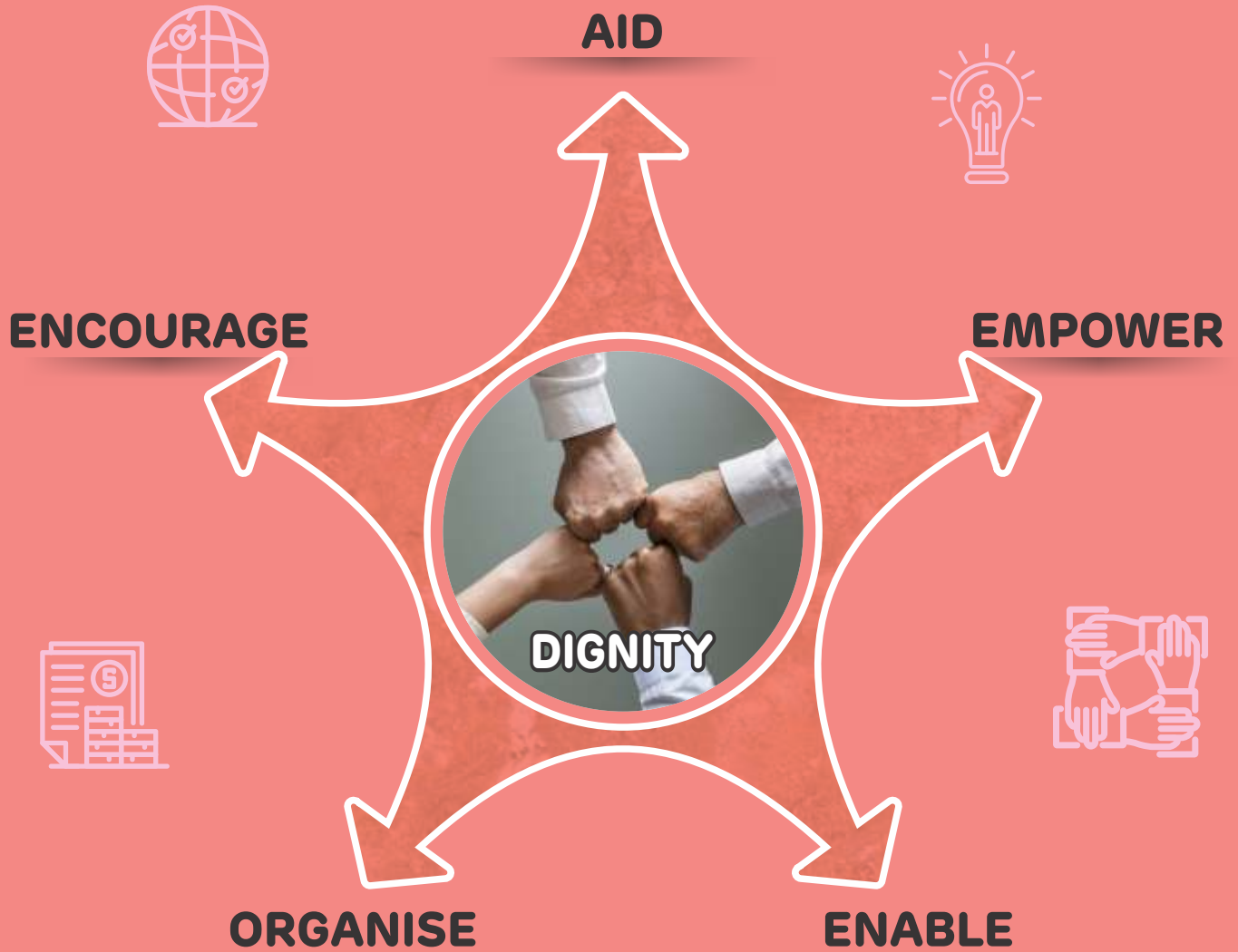
Holding Hands for a Healthy Future



Ambujakshi, an 87-year-old widow, stays with her daughter in Venganoor village of Vizhinjam. She went into depression after the death of her husband and consequently stopped paying attention to her health. It was difficult for her to go to the hospital and to bear medical expenses. Then one day, she met her saviour – the Vizhinjam Mobile Health Care Unit (MHCU) that had come to her village. As she was not willing to go to the MHCU, the MHCU staff conducted home visits, interacted with her and started medication for her. Regular medical attention for six months brought her out of depression. She is much happier now and does her daily chores herself. Such was her recovery that now she herself has started going to the MHCU for regular check-ups and receives medication for all her health issues.

Upgrading Livelihood and Uplifting Life

Mrs. Kalpana Dilip Harinkhede, a 41-year-old woman, is a small farmer in Chikhali village of Tirora. Her husband is a daily wage labourer. Their three acre land is three kilometres away from the house. She used to work on the fields to earn a livelihood for her 4-member family.

She used to grow paddy as all other farmers in the area did. In 2017, with support from Adani Foundation, she got trained and moved to organic SRI paddy growing practice. In the first year, the yield from one acre land was 17 quintals as against 13 quintals in the previous year with traditional farming.

After moving to SRI, she earned Rs. 9,000 more than the previous year. Since then, she started growing organic SRI paddy in two acres of land. She also started to grow vermibed for vermicomposting and to produce bio-gas, thereby adding to her yield and profit. Now, she is earning more than Rs. 66,000 every year. She was able to renovate her house and also construct a dug well. Her children are diligently continuing their secondary education.

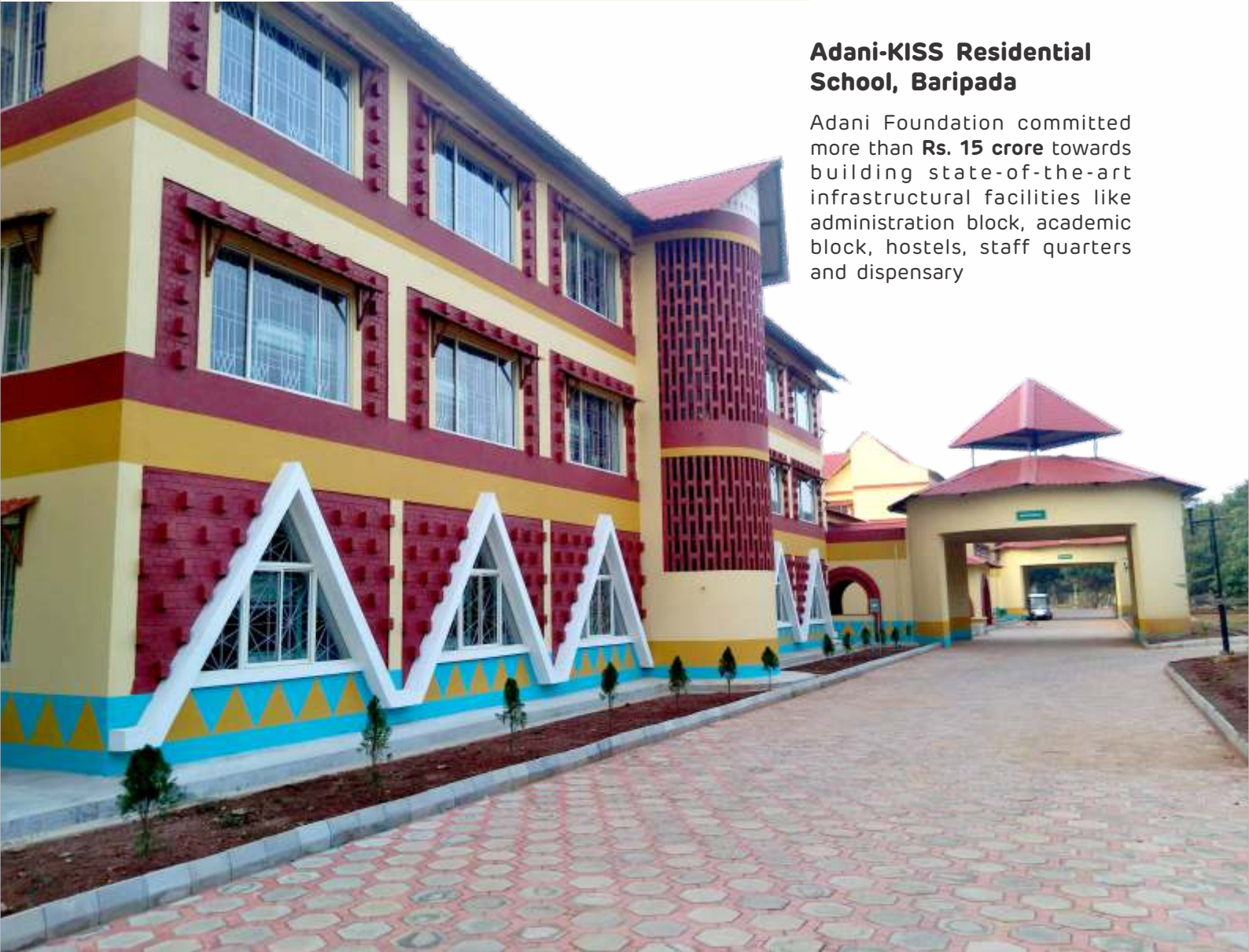

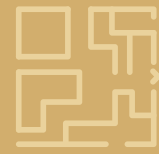

Uplifting Life from Grassroots



Mr. Nandu Tidarke, 38, lives with nine family members in Chikhali village, Tirora. He has about 2.5 acres of farmland and mostly cultivates paddy. Not having any pond or well at the farm, he was completely dependent on seasonal rainwater for irrigation. He could not access water from a nearby channel for his Rabi crops leading to a shortage of water. Hence, he would only cultivate Kharif crops during summer. In 2019, Adani Foundation renovated the channel, thus increasing its water level. With water now available easily, Nandu started cultivating Rabi crops and paddy. He installed pipes and a pumping machine to lift water. In the first year, he harvested 21 quintal of rice through Rabi doubling his income to Rs. 30,870. In the second year, he has cultivated paddy and is hoping to harvest a good quantity of rice. He is thankful to Adani Foundation for helping him generate an income that will sustain his family throughout the year.

- Adani Foundation and Adani Wilmar made an agreement with Government of Gujarat for implementation of Fortune SuPoshan project in the Narmada district in June 2018
- Predominantly a tribal district with **81.5%** tribal population, Narmada ranks low on nutritional parameters
- Entire district was adopted to make it malnutrition & anaemia free in the next **5 years**
- Supporting Poshan Abhiyan - the Flagship programme of Government of India

No Mother is Devoid of Milk for her Child

Lilaben joined Fortune SuPoshan as a SuPoshan Sangini in December 2018. She received training and started working in her village Sejpur, Narmada. She was given the task of interacting with families and identifying severely malnourished children by taking their weight, height & MUAC and understanding the causes. When she had just begun work, she met Ramniben Kanubhai Vasava (39). Her 4-month-old son was severely undernourished, weighing only 4.2 kg against a normal weight of 6.2 kg. The reason was that he was fed only goat's milk as Ramniben was not able to produce breast milk.

After consultation with her supervisor, Lilaben prepared a feeding chart. She explained to Ramniben the importance of breastfeeding. She not only motivated her but showed her video tutorials, ensured that she took a nutritious diet and followed proper sanitation practices. At the age of 6 months, children are also given supplementary nutritious food. Though Ramniben had given up hope on being able to feed with her own breast milk, but she kept trying. By end of February, she was feeding her child with her own milk. She could not believe it and her eyes were filled with tears of gratitude for the Sangini Lilaben. In the next two months, her child shifted from malnourished status and gained substantial weight. They, along with the entire family, cherished the results of their efforts.

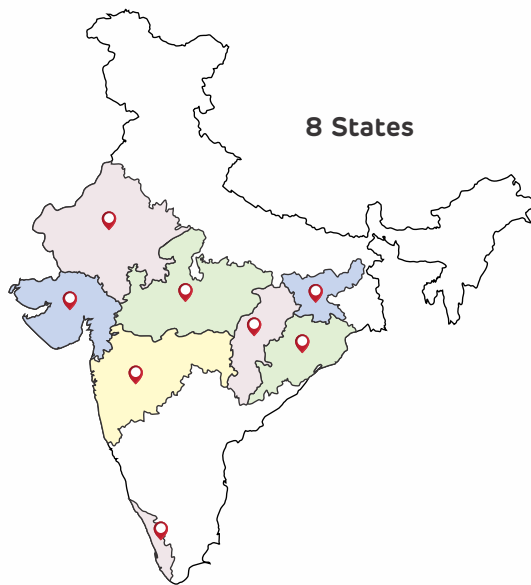

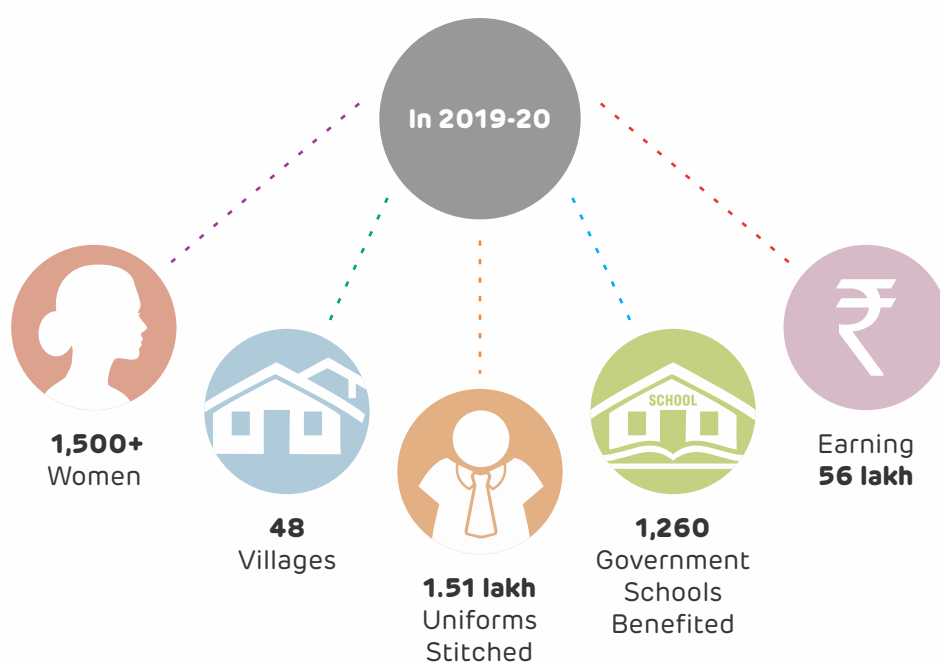

- More than **1,500** women formed a Self-Help Group (SHG) to run their business
- **Phoolo Jhano Saksham Ajivika Sakhi Mandal** acquired government order worth **Rs. 12 crore** to stitch school uniforms for **1.5 lakh** students
- Their average income is **Rs. 9,000** to **Rs. 10,000** per month
- Transparent accounting system and digital payments made to all the stakeholders



Empowered Women

Shanta Devi belongs to Motia village and is married to Pankaj Ram, a teacher in a private school. He is the sole bread earner of their family of eight members. Shanta had always wanted to share her husband's financial burden but the lack of education deterred her. So when Adani Foundation opened a Sewing Training Centre in her village, she enrolled herself immediately. To support local talent and economy, the District Administration of Godda gave an order to PJSASM for stitching school uniforms for 1.51 lakh students worth Rs. 6.10 crore. In due course of time, Shanta became the group secretary, leading and taking decisions on behalf of 1,000 women while earning Rs. 20,000 per month from tailoring work.



Lucy Jha's story of self-reliance is equally inspirational. Being allowed to study only till Std. 12 and then married off at 18 years of age, her life was strewn with struggles. She embraced a happy, married life until her husband suffered from a stroke just after 2 years of their life together with no chances of recovery. Lucy was taking care of her husband and children while doing stitching work from home, fetching Rs. 3,000 monthly. Her determination found a fitting opportunity when she enrolled in PJSASM. From working as a sewing operator to getting elected as the President of the group, she has come a long way, earning Rs. 15,000 through tailoring work and Rs. 5,000 as the president.

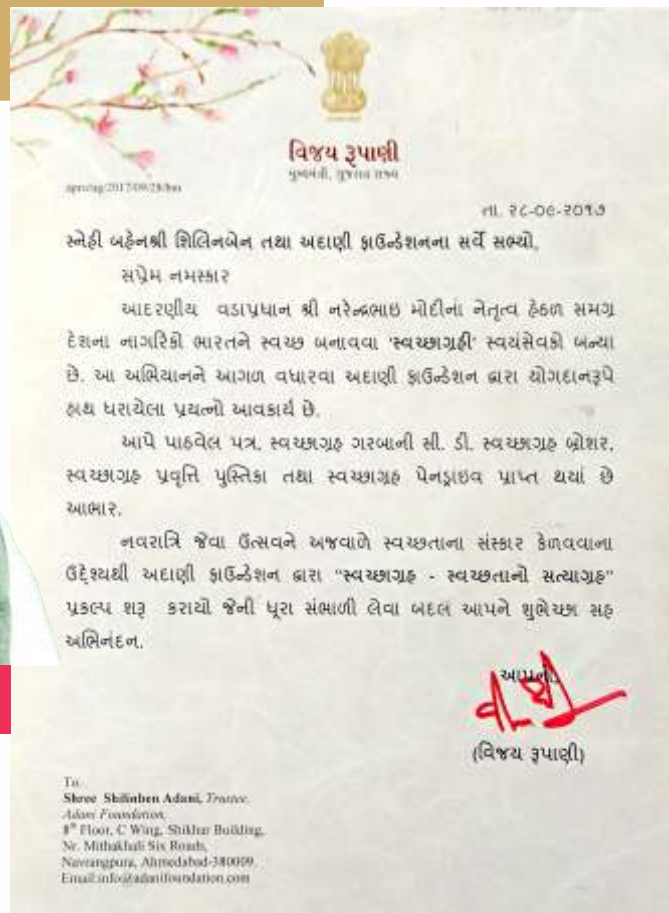

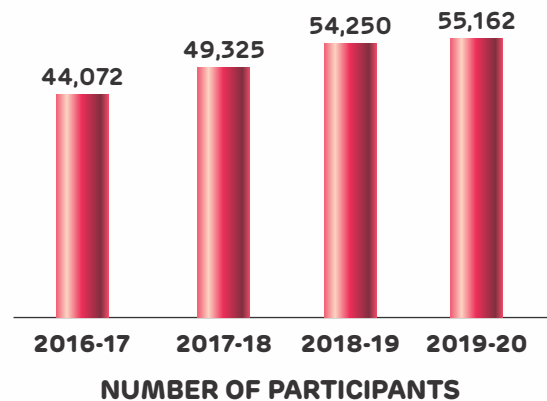
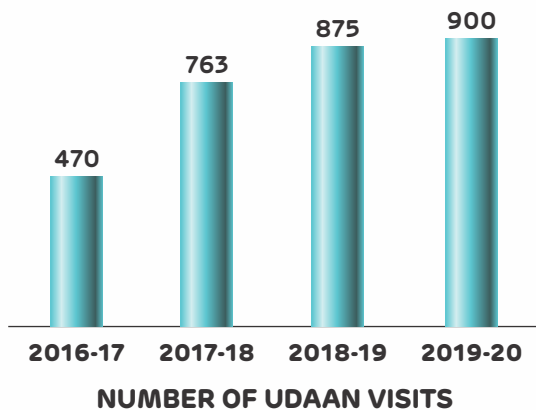
