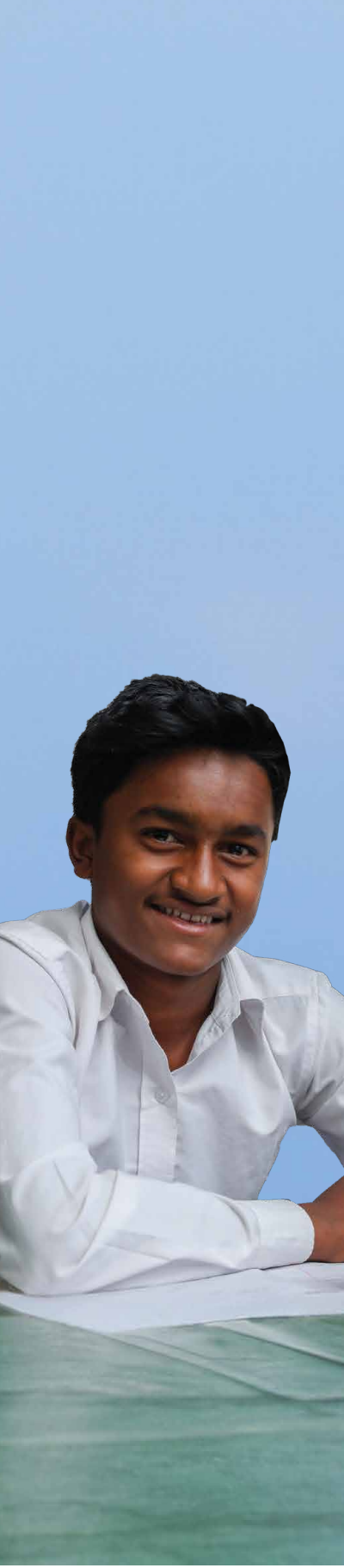

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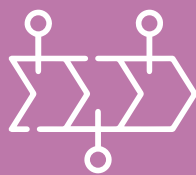
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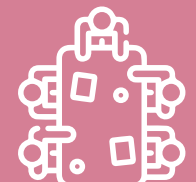

By building institutions of people and focusing on sustainability, the Foundation contributes to the dignity, well-being and wealth of the communities surrounding the Group's businesses and beyond.

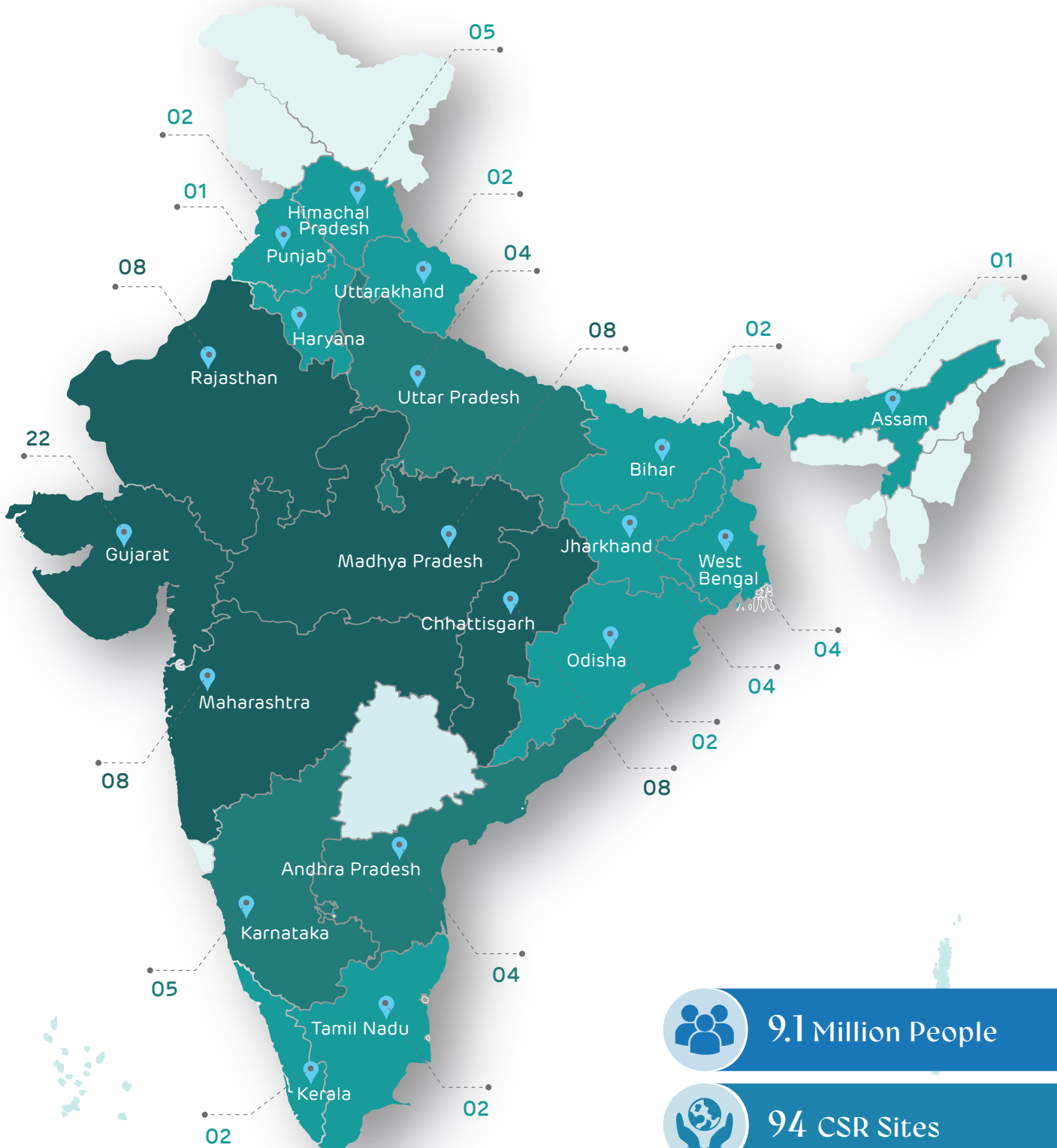

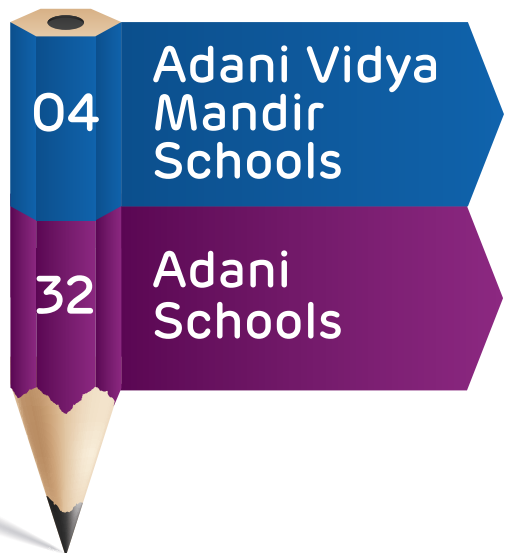
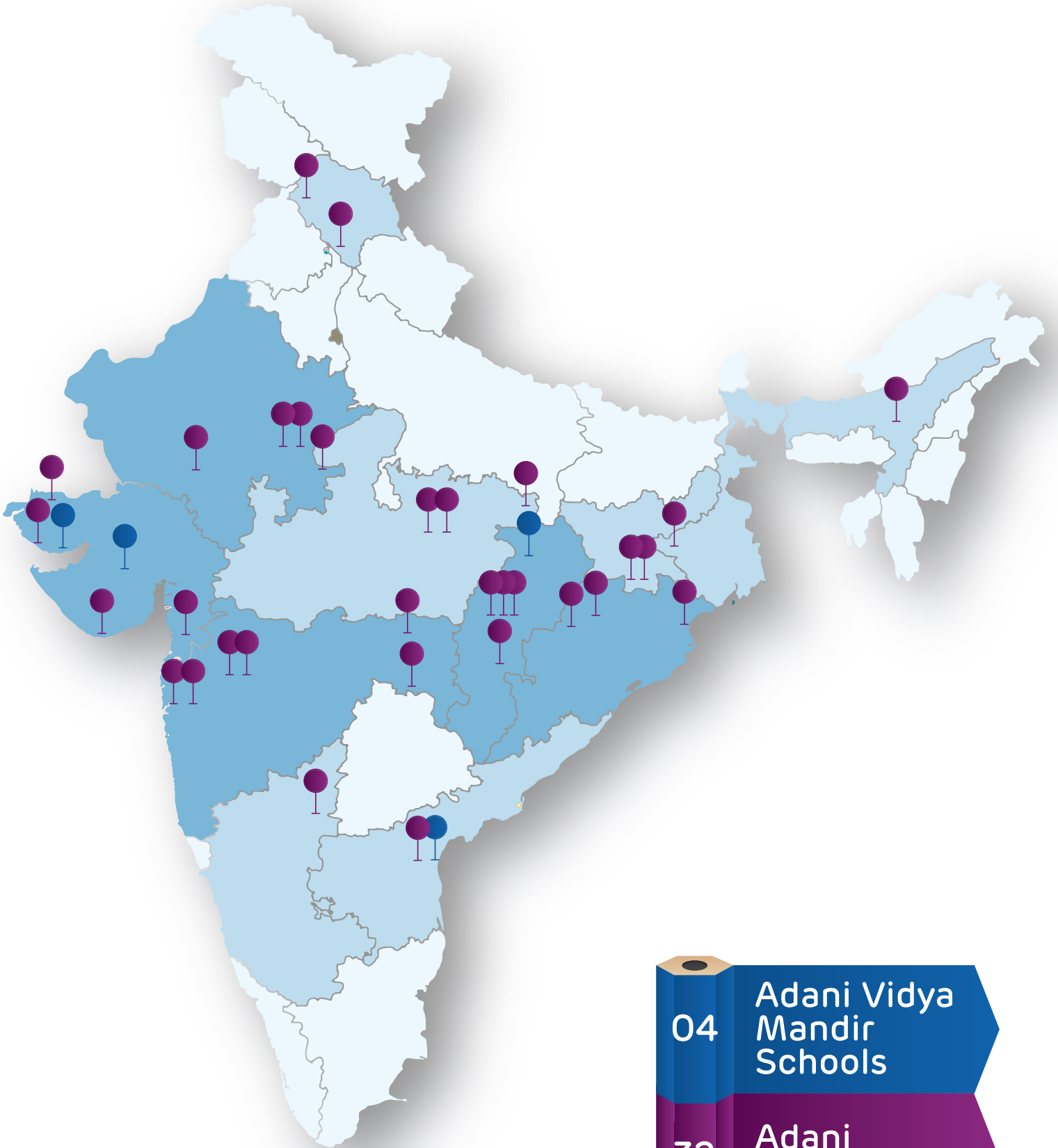

Creating STEM Curriculum Framework in the Indian Context

The Adani Foundation has partnered with the National Institute of Education (NIE), Singapore, facilitated by Temasek Foundation, to develop a STEM curriculum framework tailored to the Indian context.

Phase III of the programme was concluded wherein 5 experts from NIE, Singapore, along with **18 selected teachers from seven Adani schools** demonstrated the framework in classrooms.



Adani Sainik School: A Surreal Transformation

Established in 2019, Adani World School in Krishnapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, received approval from the Ministry of Defense to launch Adani Sainik School under the Sainik School Society, New Delhi, in 2022.

In a remarkable achievement, **the school rose from 14th place in April 2023 to 1st place nationally in March 2024**, among the newly launched Sainik Schools.



ACC School Hits a Century

A century is a rare and precious milestone, more so for an educational institution in our nation's rural heartland. On December 29, 2023, the ACC Higher Secondary School Kymore, Madhya Pradesh, completed **100 years of its meaningful existence**. The

celebrations were graced by Dr Priti G Adani, Chairperson of the Adani Foundation. What was established in the year 1923 as a two-room school within the factory quarters by CP Portland Cement Limited has grown into a trailblazing institution.

A Personalized Touch to Chase Excellence

Priyanshi Vaghasiya is the daughter of a diamond polish worker whose education began in a Gujarati medium school. The tide turned with her admission in Adani Vidya Mandir, Ahmedabad (AVMA) in class III, as her schooling till class XII would now be taken care of. But life threw a curveball at Priyanshi when she was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes at the age of 12 years. Managing her condition was a daily battle. The period of puberty brings many changes in the body, more so for a child trying to manage a health condition. Priyanshi's health-related challenges peaked in Class XII, when she was hospitalized for months and unable to attend school. As she stood on the brink of quitting her studies altogether, Priyanshi found an unwavering support system in her teachers at AVMA. What began as years of gentle counselling, culminated into personalized and constructive remedial sessions that helped her regain confidence. Thus began her arduous but fulfilling journey of academic recovery in January 2024. The final stretch towards the CBSE Board exams was gruelling but Priyanshi emerged victorious. Simultaneously, the school guided her to crack Gujarat Common Entrance Test (GUJCET). Priyanshi has now secured admission to pursue B.Tech in one of the city's best colleges. Her smiles have returned, bringing joy to her parents and teachers.





Celebrating Our Students' Special Moments

600 students of Adani Vidya Mandir, Bhadrashwar, dedicated their 12th annual day to United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). They pledged to plant and nurture 25,000 saplings over a period of three years, in their school premises and in the surroundings, including mangroves on the coastline.

Utthan

Enabling Learning. Improving Outcomes.

Utthan aims to improve learning outcomes in Government schools by enhancing the quality of education, mainstreaming progressive learners, and creating an enabling learning environment. The programme is implemented by creating a cadre of empowered educators, called Utthan Sahayaks, from within the community. The Sahayaks focus on strengthening foundational literacy and numeracy, especially among the 'priya' students – the progressive learners.

As part of Utthan, Adani Evening Education Centres provide remedial classes to deserving high school students to improve their board exam results and Adani Competitive Coaching Centres prepare students for various scholarships and competitive exams.

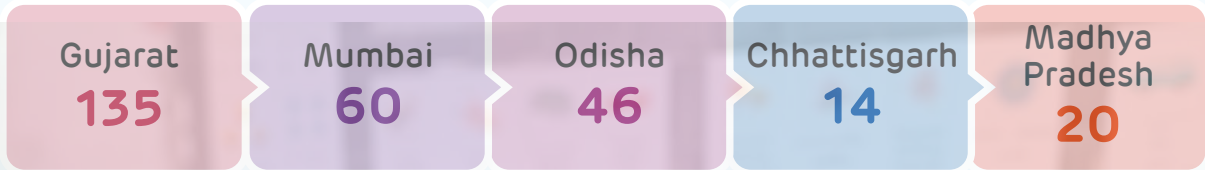

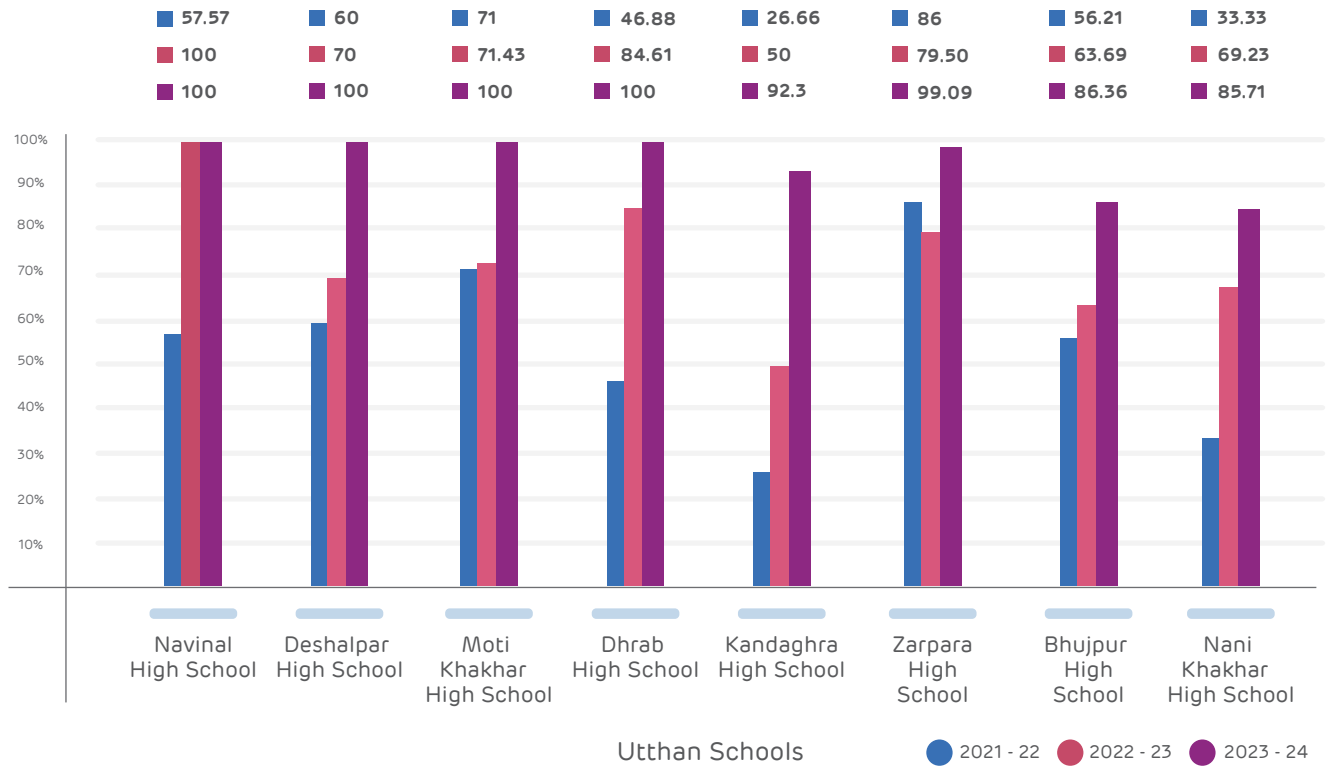

Passing percentage rockets: Year-on-year improvement in Class X Board Exam Result of 8 Government schools in Mundra, Gujarat

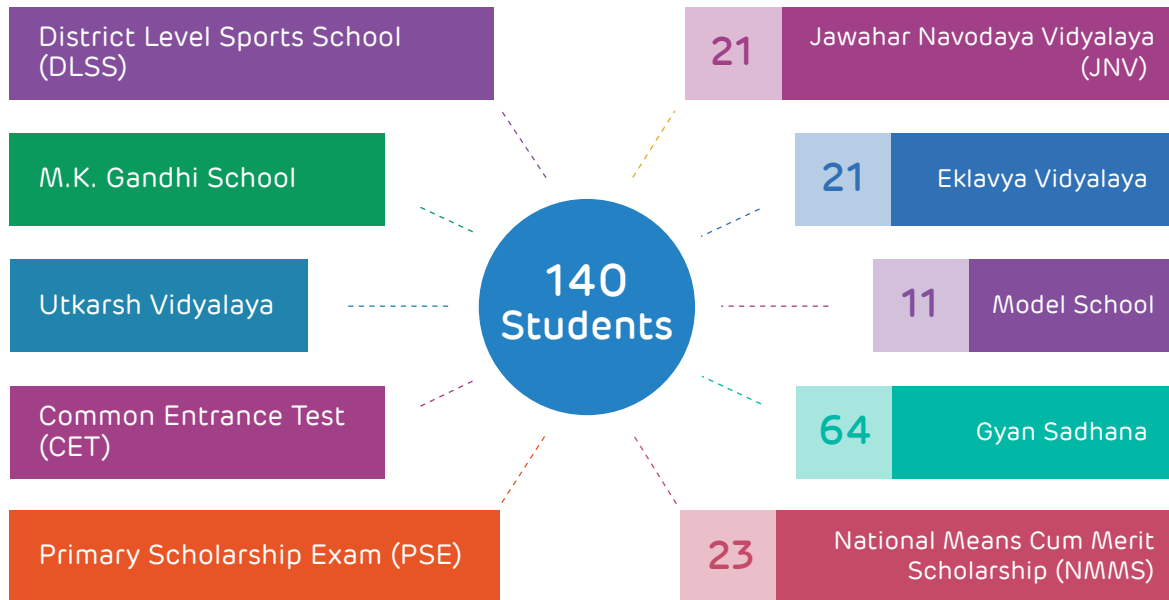

Academic Triumph through Perseverance & Timely Support

Chandan Jain is a determined young boy from Salpura village in Kawai, Rajasthan, who has faced significant physical challenges in life due to his disability. His father suffers from paralysis, leaving a severe financial constraint on the family. His mother, trained in stitching by the Adani Foundation, approached the Adani Competitive Coaching Centre hoping to get due guidance from there. The centre supported Chandan's journey to prepare for admission into the prestigious government-run Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya. Armed with perseverance, Chandan passed with flying colours. Like Chandan, 21 students from underserved communities secured admissions into JNVs this year with the support of Foundation-run coaching centres. Starting in the academic year 2024-25, they will receive free education and residential facilities from classes 6 to 12. These coaching centres help meritorious children fulfill their dreams for a promising future while also bringing relief to their families.

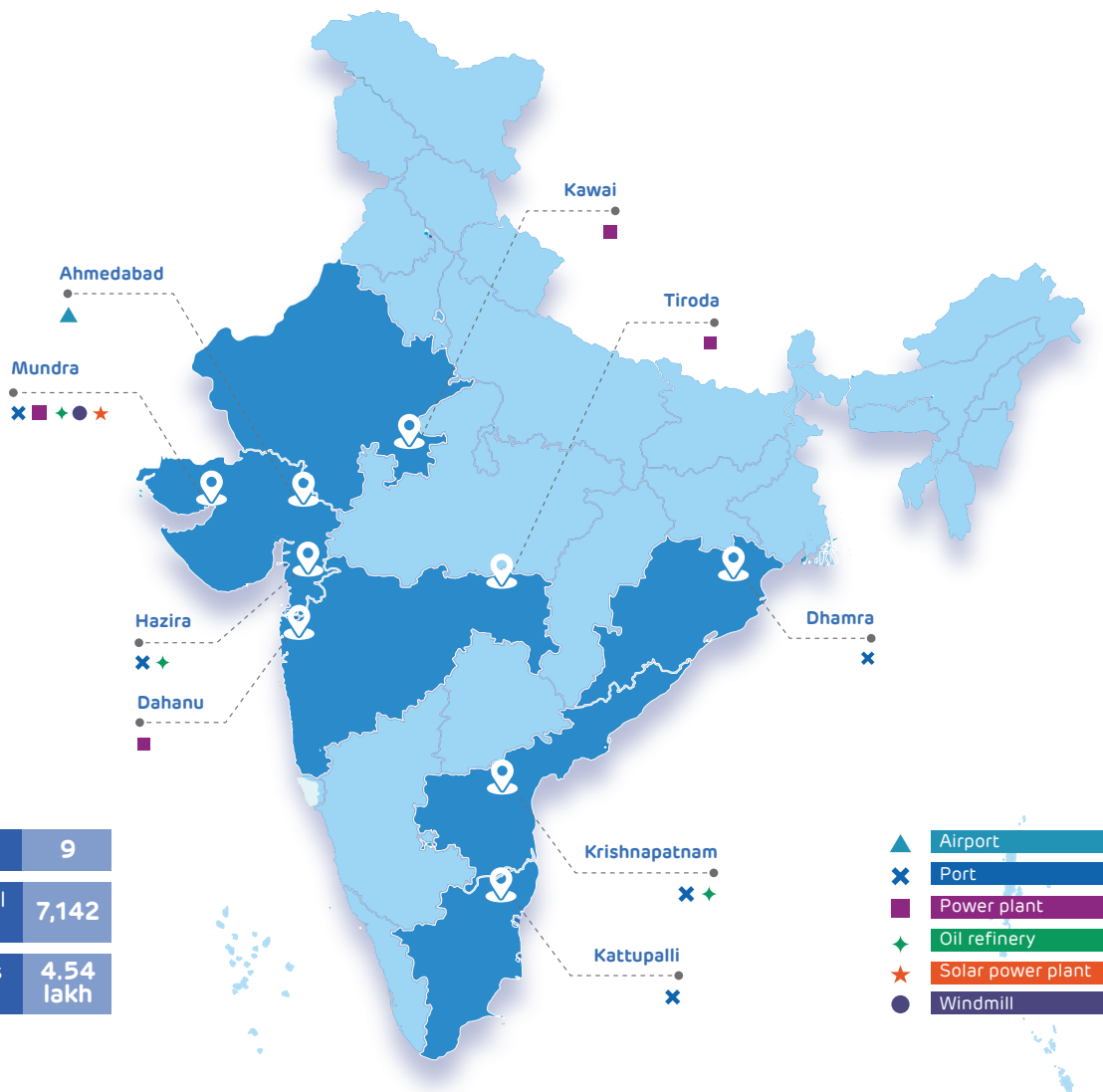




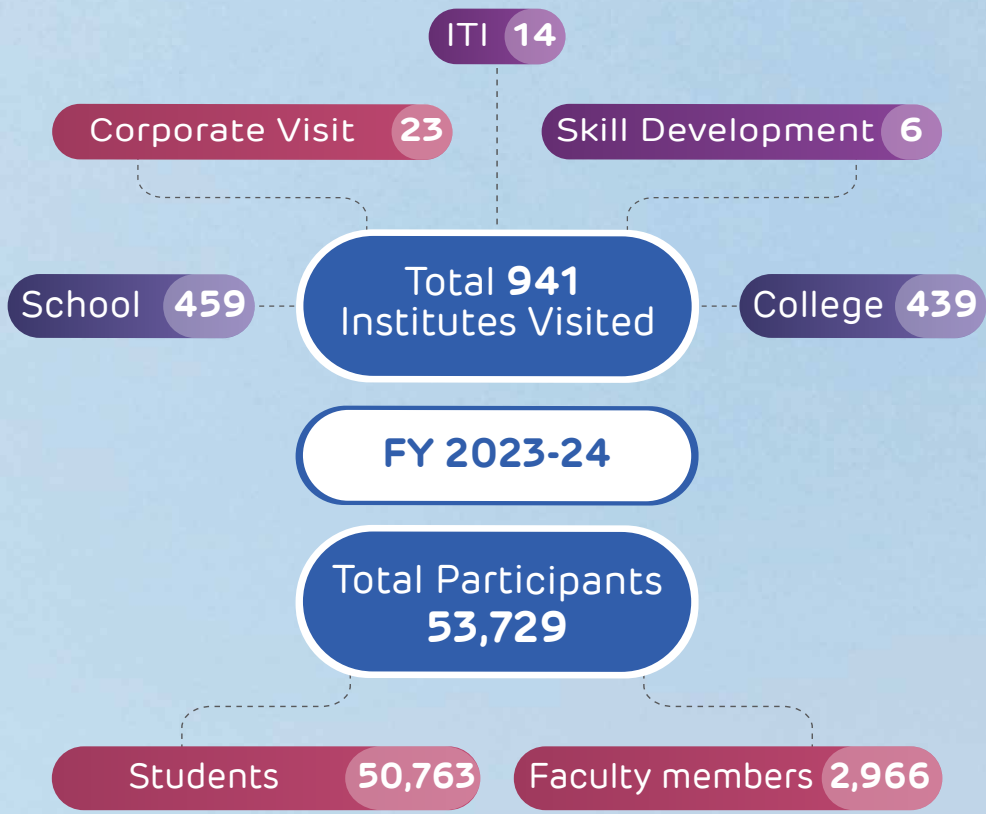
Udaan

Health & Nutrition

Ensuring Equitable Access.

India is experiencing a significant rise in non-communicable diseases such as diabetes, heart disease, and cancer that are a leading cause of mortality. Further, maternal and child mortality rates remain grim in rural areas. With a vision to foster an equitable society where everyone, across all age groups, can lead a healthy and productive life, the Adani Foundation focuses on both preventive and curative healthcare solutions. Our commitment for improving the health and nutrition status of the neediest sections of the society has taken the shape of several projects. This includes **mobile healthcare units** and **health camps** for primary care, **rural clinics and hospitals** for secondary and tertiary care, and project **SuPoshan** to combat malnutrition and anaemia by empowering village-level volunteers as SuPoshan Sanginis.

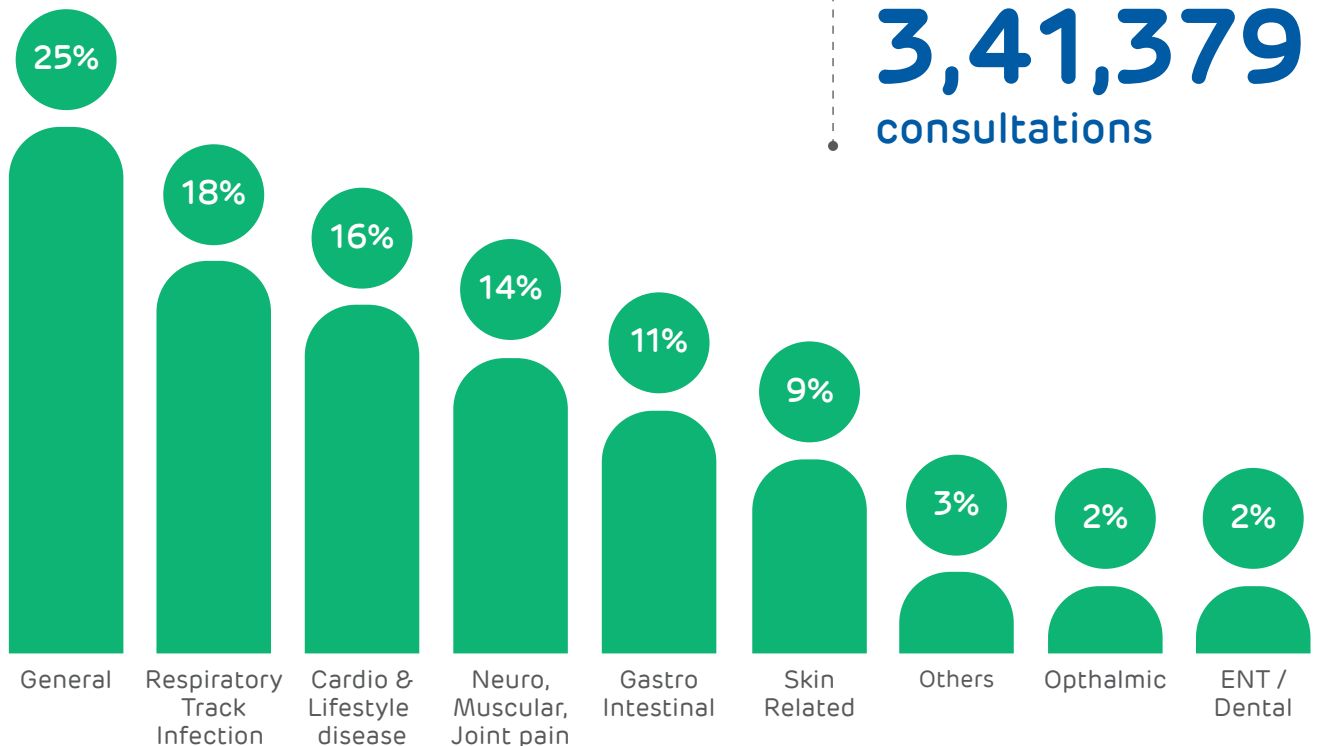

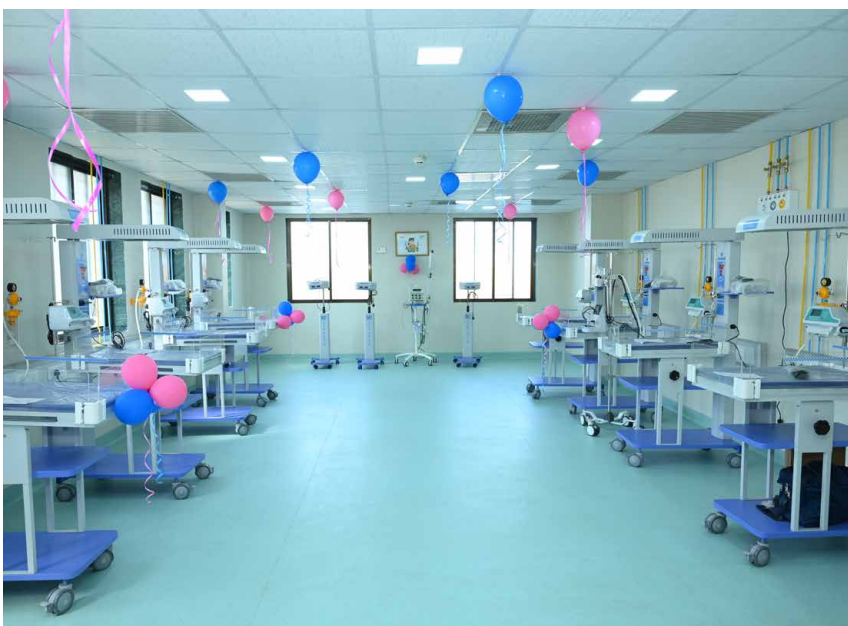

Mother and Child Care Unit, Dahanu

A Mother and Child Care Unit (MCCU) has been constructed in Dahanu, Maharashtra, by the Adani Foundation.

It is the first MCCU in the entire Palghar district of Maharashtra which is focusing exclusively on prenatal and postpartum care.

Physiotherapy Centre, Dhamra

Physiotherapy provides effective and personalized treatment options for individuals seeking rehabilitation and improved physical function.

In FY 2023-24, the physiotherapy centre in Dhamra, Odisha, catered to more than 2,200 patients seeking preventive and post operative support.

Physical Therapy Improves Way of Life

29-year-old Jamuna Patra, who hails from Narasinghaprasad village in Odisha is a patient of osteoarthritis. For nearly half a decade, she was grappling with excruciating knee pain, which made it difficult for her to do her daily chores. At an age where she had the responsibility to manage her entire family and household, she had to depend on others. She had consulted numerous orthopedic specialists and had spent considerable amount of money on her treatment, but to no avail. It was then that she discovered the Adani Foundation run wellness centre in Dhamra which offered physiotherapy treatment. The consulting doctor advised her to undergo 10 days of physiotherapy sessions, post which she experienced significant pain relief. With medicines and a routine of exercises to be done at home, the pain has subsided, and Jamuna is thankful to be able live a near-normal life after a long time.





SuPoshan

Breaking the Vicious Cycle of Malnutrition.

Project SuPoshan is a community-based intervention to combat malnutrition in children under five years of age and improve the nutritional status of adolescent girls and women in the reproductive age group. It is an initiative of Adani Wilmar, implemented by the Adani Foundation. Village level volunteers are identified and trained to become SuPoshan Sanginis, who play a pivotal role in spreading awareness and promoting referrals. They catalyze behavioural change by engaging community members in a gamut of activities like screening of target groups, cooking demonstrations, and counselling sessions for families. Supplementing the Government of India's Poshan Abhiyaan, SuPoshan is striving to break the vicious cycle of malnutrition and promoting access to Government services.

Key outcomes from Narmada



Jasmina's Journey from SAM to Healthy Category

During a routine household visit in Geondab (Haldia, West Bengal), SuPoshan Sangini Madhumita Hazra identified that Jasmina Parvin (22 months) was suffering from Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM). Despite explaining the harmful effects, Jasmina's parents refused assistance. When the little girl suffered from a long fever, Madhumita recommended that she be admitted to a Nutrition Rehabilitation Centre (NRC) but her parents refused.

Two days later, Jasmina stopped eating entirely and her parents finally accepted help. Madhumita coordinated with an ASHA worker, and admitted the child to nearest NRC centre where the child took 14 days of treatment and returned with Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) status. The Sangini supported her mother through counselling



and helped develop a kitchen garden to take better care of her dietary requirements. Jasmina's improvement from SAM to MAM, and eventually to healthy, showcased Madhumita's relentless dedication and symbolizes the behavioural change that project SuPoshan aims to inculcate. Jasmina's mother not only praises Madhumita's dedicated efforts in taking care of her child but is also thankful about the kitchen garden – the produce from which is consumed by the whole family.



Sustainable Livelihoods

Augmenting and Diversifying Incomes.

The Adani Foundation is working to augment and diversify the income of communities at the grassroots by establishing a self-sustaining ecosystem that harnesses human potential and community resources for socio-economic progress. Our efforts cover on-farm, off-farm, and non-farm areas, aiming to boost, diversify, and sustain incomes. Our initiatives include natural farming, lift irrigation, drip irrigation, animal husbandry, dairy development, and empowering women-owned enterprises through knowledge, skills, and market connections. **Saksham**, our skilling programme, imparts skill-based training to youths, thereby increasing their employability and entrepreneurial abilities. **Sathwaro** is a programme that aims to power art by empowering India's artisan community.

Agriculture

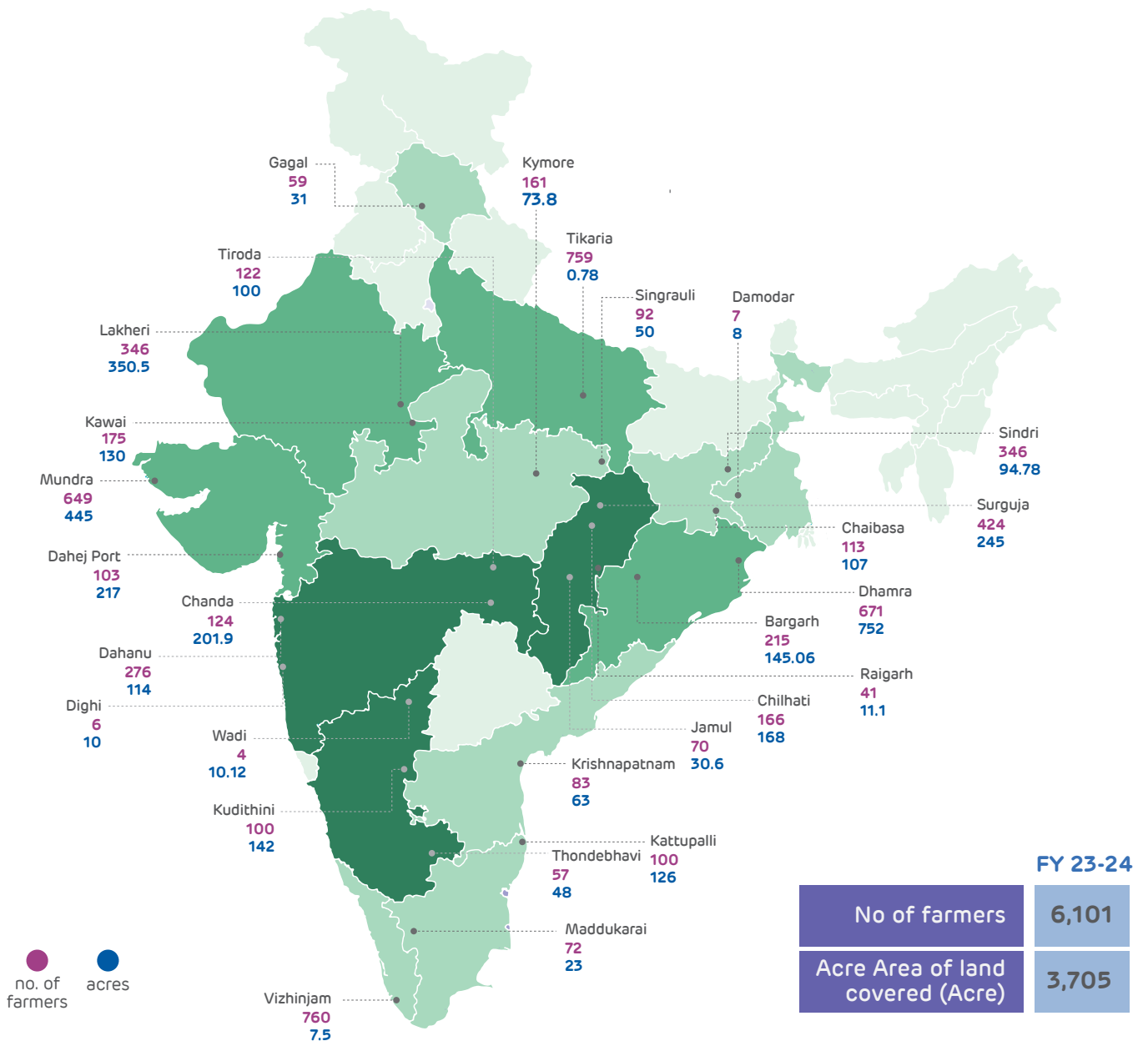
Agriculture continues to employ a large number of people, while contributing more than 15 % to the country's GDP. India's diverse agro-climatic zones - ranging from tropical to temperate - enable the cultivation of a wide variety of crops. Modernization of agricultural practices is happening at a rapid pace, and coupled with favorable government initiatives and policies, it promises a bright future for this crucial sector. The Adani Foundation is playing the role of an enabler to help extract the optimum potential of agriculture that benefits lakhs of farmers across India.

The efforts of the Adani Foundation include accessing and addressing the challenges that farmers face on the ground which directly affect their income. The Foundation undertakes steps to educate farmers to adapt farming techniques which are climate resilient. This includes promoting the

usage of drip irrigation and lift irrigation systems among them. It supports small and marginal farmers with market linkages by forming producer groups and cooperatives, and promoting crop diversification, reduce input cost, enhance quality of produce, and ultimately boost incomes.

In the recent past, the Adani Foundation has given a lot of impetus to natural farming towards enhancing soil fertility, plant growth, and enabling farmers to receive increased income from harvests. In natural farming, farmers avoid the use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides, and instead employ techniques such as crop rotation, composting, green manures, and biological pest control. This not only reduces environmental impact and input cost, but also helps in creating a more sustainable, profitable and climate resilient farming system.

Agriculture Footprint



Mundra – Leading from the Front in Natural Farming and Market Linkages

The Adani Foundation has initiated giving impetus to natural farming in Mundra and Kutch region. It is engaging with the farmers to leverage the goodness of natural farming. It is instrumental in imparting knowledge and spreading awareness about natural farming in the region. The aim is to enhance quality yield, thereby increasing the incomes of farmers and safeguarding soil health in the process. The Foundation is supporting farmers to conduct regular soil testing to check and manage Carbon content in soil effectively. It is also promoting cow-centered approach in farming under which cows and other cattle help run biogas units facilitated by the Adani Foundation and byproducts like slurry are used as organic manure. Cow urine is also used as organic pesticides across the farms.

Towards spreading the knowledge base about natural farming, the Foundation has conducted trainings for farmers (over 2000), covering 26 villages in and around Mundra. The training sessions included live demonstration of using cost-effective organic fertilizers and its benefits. Under the natural farming initiative, the Adani Foundation, in collaboration with the district rural development department, facilitated 468 home

biogas units to farmers. This is enabling them to save money by using the gas for cooking and other domestic purposes and utilizing the slurry as manure.

The concerted efforts of the Adani Foundation have made natural farming popular in the region with 825 farmers adopting the practice and covering over 1600 acres of farmland. The Foundation has also facilitated the formation of a farmers' group, namely 'Raj Shakti Prakrutik Kheti Sahkari Mandali', comprising 35 farmers. These farmers had the opportunity to meet Hon'ble Governor of Gujarat, Shri. Acharya Devvrat, at his Gandhinagar residence. The Governor also visited Mundra to address a gathering of over 2000 farmers at an event organized by the Adani Foundation. In his address, he emphasized upon the benefits and importance of adopting natural farming practices. He also met progressive farmers (as part of his field visit) practicing natural farming under the guidance of the Foundation.

Recently, Gujarat Organic Products and Certification Agency (GOPCA) certified 28 farmers of the 'Raj Shakti Prakrutik Kheti Sahkari Mandali' group. This will ensure they receive best prices for their farm products.



Leveraging Vermicomposting

Vermicomposting is a simple biotechnological composting process that uses certain earthworms to enhance the process of waste conversion to produce good-quality manure. The resultant product is a stabilized, uniformly sized substance with a characteristic earthy appearance known as vermicompost. The Adani Foundation is engaging farmers in learning and adapting the process while also helping them to start vermicompost production for natural farming.

Tribals in Chaibasa (Jharkhand) Using Solar-powered Pumps for Irrigation

Solar pumps use clean and renewable energy, reduce dependence on fossil fuels while also decreasing carbon emissions. The farming fraternity (mostly comprising people from tribal community) in Chaibasa, Jharkhand, are predominantly dependent on income from their farms, animal husbandry, and poultry. When the Foundation first introduced solar-powered lift irrigation to them, the response was timid. The Foundation assured them and made them aware about the benefits of using these new farming technologies. It also provided them support in the form of initial cost of installation of these pumps. Over 160 farmers are benefitting from 6 solar-powered pumps, enabling the irrigation of more than 137.2 acres of farmland. They are creating more income avenues by adding cash crops.



Drip - Sprinkler Irrigation and Shed-Net in Chanda (Maharashtra)

Access and availability of water for agricultural purpose remains one of the most critical challenges of farmers in Chanda in Chandrapur, Maharashtra. The Adani Foundation is addressing this concern by installing lift irrigation system. It is bringing water through a 2 km pipeline that covers 100 acres of farmland. Similarly, a sprinkler irrigation system has been provided to more than 100 farmers which is covering another 100 acres of farmland. The Foundation has also provided

shed nets to farmers (especially designed to serve the requirement of small landholding farmers). It has facilitated in developing a 240 sqm shed net to reduce the direct exposure of crops to the sun and also to control the pests. The shed net intervention has helped the farmers reduce temperature by 5 degrees Celsius, a 65-70% reduction in pests' attacks while allowing farmers to grow 7 vegetable crops in a year with 75% less water.

Revolutionizing Agriculture: The impact of sprinkler irrigation in Yavatmal, Maharashtra

In Yavatmal, Maharashtra, where surface and groundwater sources are scarce, the adoption of sprinkler irrigation stands as a model of sustainable agriculture. Sandip Vasanta Wasukar, a 42-year-old progressive farmer from Shindola village, epitomizes the transformative power of modern irrigation method facilitated by the Adani Foundation.

He cultivates a diverse range of crops, including Cotton, Wheat, Mustard, Millet and other vegetables, across his 8-acre land. The introduction of sprinkler irrigation through the water conservation project marked a pivotal moment in his farming journey. No longer burdened by labor and cost intensive flood irrigation, Sandip now relies on the efficiency of his sprinkler system to nourish his field. He is benefitting with additional income of INR 35,000-45,000 annually. 99 farmers have received sprinkler units covering 245 acres of land.

Empowering Tribal Farmers

Tribal farmers face numerous challenges in agriculture, including small landholdings, dependence on rainfall and lack of access to modern agricultural techniques and practices, leading to low farm productivity. In Tamnar, Chhattisgarh, the Adani Foundation is addressing these concerns by bringing farmers together for group farming. In Milupara village, the Foundation, after interacting with tribal farmers with small landholding, motivated them for group farming to practice efficient and sustainable agriculture. After facilitation by the Adani Foundation, 10 tribal farmers with average landholdings of 1 acre or less formed the Jay Budha Dev Farmers Group with combined landholding of 11.64 acres.

The Foundation helped the group in land levelling, bringing electricity line to the farm, and provided 5HP pump for irrigation purpose. The group was

provided with high-quality paddy seeds and vegetable seeds. While individually they were forced to do only paddy cultivation during rainy season, after support of the Adani Foundation, they are now able to utilize both summer (Kharif) and winter (Rabi) seasons to grow crops such as Paddy, Peanuts, Lentils, Wheat and Vegetables.

After adapting group farming, there has been a considerable increase in the incomes of farmers of the Jay Budha Dev Farmers Group. While in the first year, they sold INR 1.65 lakh worth of harvest, the amount has gone up to 3.92 lakhs in the reporting year.

Most of the farmlands in this region are near the forest. The Foundation has helped resolve another big concern for the group by fencing their farmlands to protect it from wild animals, which were earlier posing a serious threat to their crops.





Animal Husbandry and Dairy

Livestock and Dairy play a crucial role in diversifying farming income sources and mitigating risks associated with crop failures due to unpredictable weather patterns and price fluctuations in market. Additionally, cow dung and urine of cattle are valuable resources for organic manure, they enhance soil fertility and reduce the dependency on chemical fertilizers, thereby creating an ecosystem for natural farming. Dairy

is the most important agriculture subsidiary business for farmers. The Adani Foundation is working to increase milk yield by implementing cattle breed improvement, cattle healthcare, fodder development and facilitating marketing linkages of the milk and milk products. The approach is dedicated to building a financial safety net for farming communities and make them sustainable.

Focus on Breed Improvement of Cattle

The Foundation is working to optimize the benefits of Artificial Insemination (AI) to usher in prosperity in the lives of the farmers. AI is an advanced reproductive technique that allows farmers to improve the genetic quality of their herd by using superior semen from high-yield

bulls. Since 2019, the Foundation has been promoting AI using sex-sorted semen to ensure female calves are born. This will ultimately lead to an increase in the production of milk, thereby increasing incomes of the farmers.

Cattle Health Camps and Vaccinations

Easy access to quality healthcare for cattle is essential for farmers to get maximum benefit from their livestock. At the grassroots, the Adani Foundation has been working to facilitate regular health check-ups of cattle, their treatment and vaccination, while also ensuring easy access and

availability of medicines. In Dhamra (Odisha), a mobile veterinary van is operating throughout the year to benefit farmers belonging to 11 gram panchayats. In the reporting financial year, it has benefited over 81,258 cattle belonging to more than 27,000 farmers.

Income Enhancements Through Dairy Development

The Adani Foundation has been actively promoting dairy development at the grassroots to boost incomes of the farmers. By bringing cattle farmers together and sensitizing them on ways to capitalize on a demand-driven market, it has facilitated establishment of farmers' producer companies to operate village-level milk collection centres. These centres are being run by members of women SHG groups, and they serve as storage facilities for milk, which is later supplied to AMUL. The women managers of the collection centre ensure that milk is stored hygienically, and a database of farmers' details is maintained properly. By introducing improved cattle breeds and modern milk collection and storage facilities, the Foundation is creating a self-sustainable dairy ecosystem to provide long-term livelihood support to farming families.

Anuradha Dairy and Milk Collection Centre from Gondia district of Maharashtra is fetching higher prices to farmers through proper supply chain management and marketing. Understanding the potential of dairy development in the region, the Adani Foundation introduced an integrated approach including breed improvement, fodder management, cattle healthcare services, and marketing of milk in 26 villages. The Foundation supported in the formation of a Farmer Producer Company named Tiroda Farmer Producer Company Ltd (TFPCL) in

2019. Through TFPCL, the Foundation facilitated setting up Anuradha Dairy initiative with the support of AMUL. It is currently benefiting more than 2,000 farmers of Tiroda block. The FPO runs 45 Milk Collection Centres with the support of SHGs of Mahila Arthik Vikas Mahamandal (MAVIM). The collected milk is supplied to the Panchmahal District Co-operative Milk Producer's Union Ltd., Godhra (Gujarat) under the brand Anuradha Dairy. Presently, the dairy is collecting 17,000 litres milk per day. In FY 2023-24, Anuradha Dairy collected an average of 3.1 lakh litres milk per month with an average monthly payment of INR 1.5 crore directly into farmers' bank accounts. Cumulatively, the dairy farmers of Tiroda have earned INR 36.94 crore since the inception of the project. They are getting 30%-40% higher price for the milk collected.

Apart from benefitting the farmers, Anuradha Dairy has generated employment for 134 women with monthly income of INR 4,000 to 5,000. These women, organized in the form of a self-help group (SHG), run the milk collection centres. Looking at the success of this dairy model, this initiative is expanding with the support of state government. It is adding a 30 KLPD milk chilling centre, which will start its operations soon, covering two blocks of Gondia district.

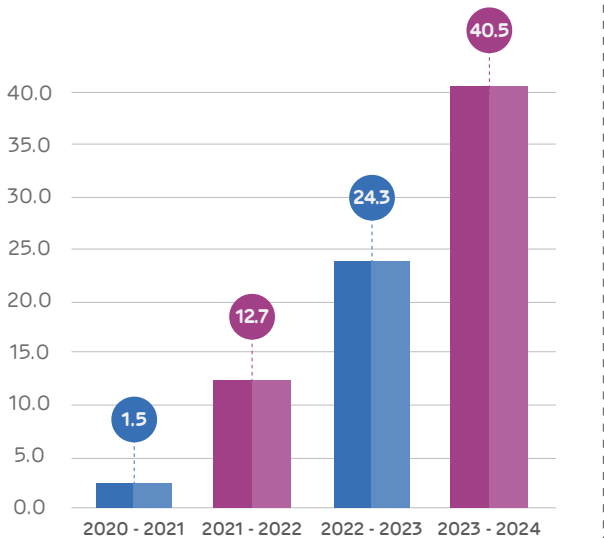




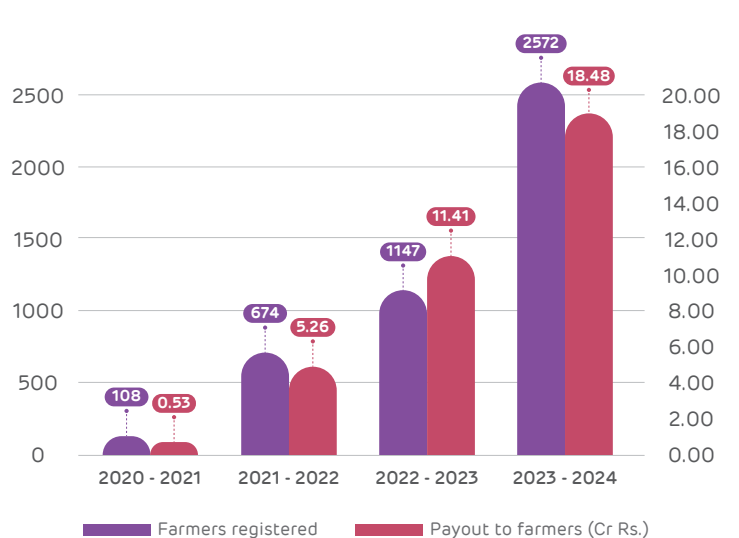

Impetus on High Quality Fodder

In Gujarat, the Adani Foundation is working to promote the use of high-quality fodder (Napier grass), as it is drought-resistant, rich in essential nutrients, comes with high yield per acre, and also prevents soil erosion.

In Mundra, a denuded pastureland of 218 acres has been converted into a flourishing multispecies grassland and is benefiting over 2000 farmers. Similarly, in Dahej (Gujarat), a 179-acre farmland has been utilized for making a green fodder agriculture demonstration with 14,320 tons fodder cultivation.

In Tiroda, Maharashtra, the Foundation is promoting cultivation of Maize and making silage. The efforts are directed to enhance income of

women farmers through direct selling of fodder and through increase in dairy milk production. To facilitate this initiative, the Adani Foundation helped 50 women from tribal communities to form a women farmer group to cultivate hybrid maize covering 50 acres of land. These women have secured average yield of 15 tons per acre in Rabi season in FY 2023-24. On an average, each woman of the group has earned INR 45,000.

Similarly, in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, the Adani Foundation is supporting farmers to get benefits of fodder cultivation. It is imparting training on hybrid Napier cultivation. More than 28 farmers (owning 17 acres of land) have started cultivating the nutritious fodder and selling to local dairy farmers.





Empowering Women

The participation of women in the economic and social spectrum of life is essential to achieve the fifth Sustainable Development Goal (SDG 5), which highlights focus on gender equality and empowerment of all women and girls by 2030. The Adani Foundation is working to ensure women get skill-based education, training (technical and non-technical) to run their businesses, while also facilitating their exposure to all possible



entrepreneurial and livelihood opportunities. The approach is to help them individually and as a group to enhance their income generation capabilities and connect them with right market channels.

Swabhimaan in Mumbai and Dahanu

Swabhimaan, an initiative of the Adani Foundation, aims to promote women's socio-economic empowerment in Dahanu and in slum area of Mumbai, Maharashtra. It is facilitating the creation of women-run micro-enterprises and building their capacities. The enterprises in the domains of stitching, jewelry making, Warli painting, home décor products, dhoop & agarbatti making etc. are covered under Swabhimaan.

In Saravali village of Dahanu, an earnest appeal from a group of 30 women to become financially independent secured the support of the Adani Foundation. These



women - already skilled in tailoring - were empowered by the Foundation through training support in process management, documentation, accounts, quality management, and administration. The women started a shirt-stitching centre with the support of the Foundation in the form of advanced industrial machines and its first shirt-making order from a nearby textile manufacturer. The centre is fulfilling stitching orders (like uniforms for Anganwadi centre children, aprons etc.) and earned INR 1,55,000 since July 2023.

Similarly, in Mumbai, Swabhimaan has benefitted more than 4,000 women. Here, it is operating with the collaboration of MAVIM. It is bringing women together through 290 Entrepreneurship-Self Help Groups (ESHGs). The Adani Foundation is training the members of ESHGs in concepts of business, book-keeping, business formation, governance, financial management and packaging & branding. It is handholding the groups for bank linkages. Collectively, the ESHGs have saved more than INR 59 Lakhs and availed bank loans worth INR 1.38 crores over the two years for investing in multiple small-scale businesses. These ESHGs are maintaining 100 percent timely repayment of bank loans.

Saheli Mahila Silai Samuh, Raipur, Chhattisgarh

With an aim to empower women with income-generating skills, the Adani Foundation, in association with the state government's Mahatma Gandhi Rural Industrial Park (RIPA), set up Saheli Mahila Silai Samuh in Raipur, Chhattisgarh, in April 2023 with 15 women. Today, the group is operating four centres in Raipur with 95 women, earned an impressive annual revenue of INR 8,63,246 lakhs, more than double from last financial year's annual revenue of INR 4,19,956. The Foundation has provided 129 hi-speed electric sewing machines to the group and facilitated skill-enhancement training by tailoring experts.



Oyster Mushroom Cultivation and Other Enterprises by Women, Tiroda, Maharashtra

The Adani Foundation is supporting Oyster Mushroom cultivation in Tiroda. It has facilitated the formation of 21 SHGs involving 250 women who are actively harvesting these highly profitable Mushroom variety. The Foundation has supported a SHG for setting-up Mushroom Spawn Production Unit with the support of Government of Maharashtra. The SHG is supplying high quality mushroom spawns to women SHGs across the Gondia district for Oyster mushroom cultivation. In the year 2023-24, the group has harvested over 12,000 kg of Oyster mushroom and collectively generated a revenue of INR 22 lakhs.



Similarly, 60 women belonging to 20 SHGs have been trained to produce incense sticks. They have produced 70,275 kg incense sticks, earning a revenue of INR 41,81,140 in the reporting financial year.

Today, as a Patient Care Assistant, she not only supports her family but also extends compassionate care to numerous patients.

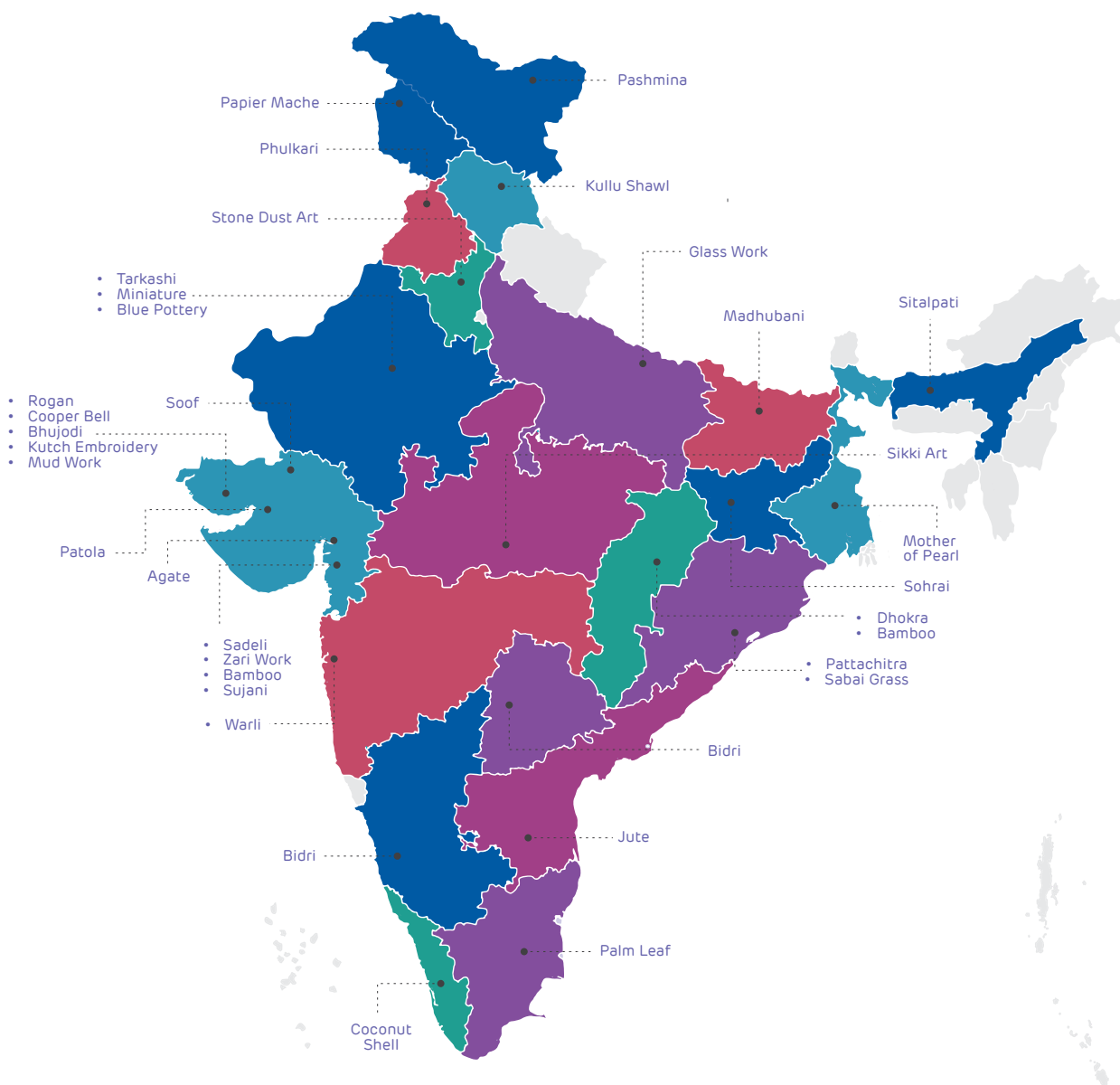

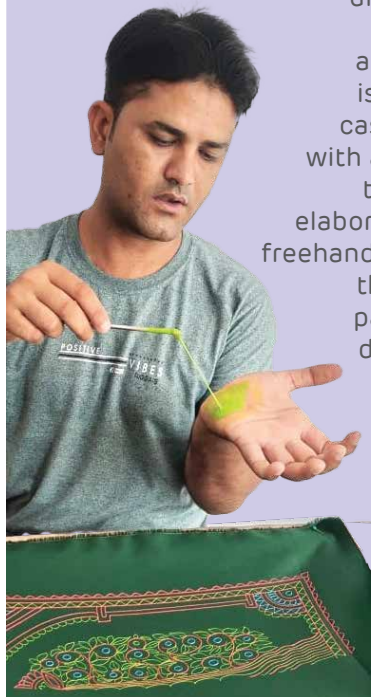

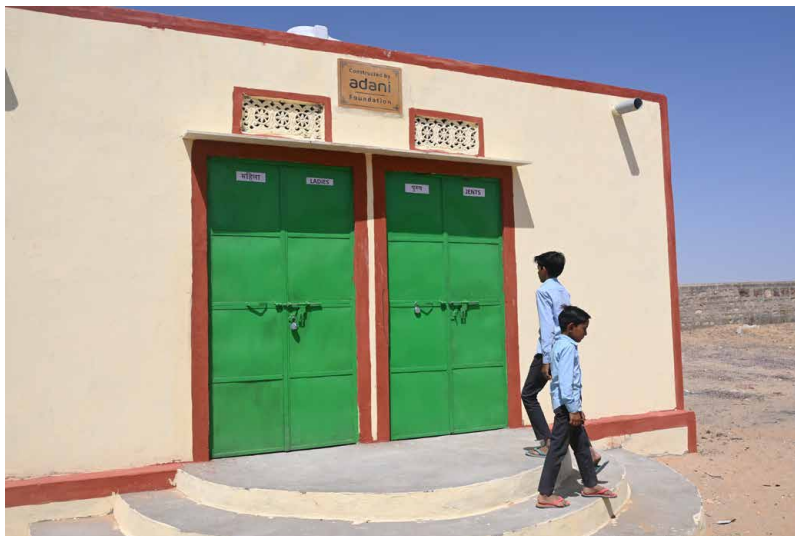

Increasing Uptake of Government Schemes

The Meri Sangini Meri Margdarshika project is aimed to improve the coverage of government schemes by creating awareness and bridging the gaps. Village-level volunteers i.e., Sanginis are trained to support eligible community members in leveraging various schemes, with a special focus on empowering women and marginalized families. In FY 2023-24, 28 Sanginis have facilitated 25,000 applications and INR 15.53 Cr worth of benefits.



Sangini Kamala Kumari's unwavering dedication and the Adani Foundation's support brought joy to Hindu Ram's family in the village of Bant, Rajasthan. Despite financial hardships caused by a discontinued old age pension, Kamala's efforts in rectifying Aadhaar discrepancies led to the reinstatement of Hindu Ram's pension, amounting to a substantial INR 12,000 for the past year.

Promoting Sports

The Adani Foundation has been actively promoting sports by facilitating trainings, ensuring robust infrastructure, and organizing tournaments. These platforms engage the youngsters and instill a sense of unity and discipline.



With an aim to encourage budding athletes, **Kabaddi training** sessions are organized in Raigarh, Chhattisgarh. 50 female athletes belonging to nine schools from 15 villages in Raigarh were identified and in FY 2023-24, a total of 60 training sessions were organized for them. They went on to participate in block, district and state level tournaments.



A 'Say No To Drugs' campaign was organized in Kattupalli, Tamil Nadu, by way of a **Kabaddi Championship** in which over 400 youth and local leaders came together to pledge to build a healthy, drug-free community.

The Adani Foundation supported para cricketer Amir Hussain Lone, who hails from Jammu and Kashmir. Having lost both arms as a child to a tragic accident at his father's mill, Amir was guided by a teacher who discovered his unique talent. He bowls using his feet, and bats by holding the bat between his shoulder and neck. He has been a professional cricketer since 2013 and is currently the captain of J&K Union para cricket team.



Drona Sports Programme

In Kymore, Madhya Pradesh, the Drona Sports programme is supporting the rural youth, especially tribal children, to explore their talents in Kabaddi, Athletics, Volleyball, Football, Judo etc. In FY 2023-24, a total of 302 trainees from 26 schools were enrolled in 3 different training centres. Out of them, 192 qualified to participate in different tournaments at district, division, state and national levels.

Relief & Rehabilitation Efforts

The Adani Foundation is committed to empowering communities in times of crisis, to alleviate suffering and help them regain stability. Our efforts embody our solidarity in the face of adversity.

Biparjoy Cyclone Relief

Cyclone Biparjoy caused widespread displacement and unrest in Gujarat's Kutch district. In the coastal town of Mundra, the Adani Foundation launched comprehensive disaster management and relief efforts in 22 affected villages, benefitting more than 17,000 people. To contribute to the preparedness, more than 4,500+ people were transferred to shelter houses. Standby ambulances, food packets and PPE kits were arranged.

1,200 fisherfolk families were provided ration kits in the coastal villages where they had migrated. The Adani Foundation team established medical camps and deployed excavators in coordination with the District Administration to clear the access routes. Recognizing the wide damage to horticultural crops in Mundra, the Foundation supported more than 350 farmers for preservation of 500 date palm trees.



Odisha Train Tragedy Response

In a tragic event, three trains collided in Balasore, Odisha, on June 2, 2023. The deadly accident costed 300 people their lives and left more than 1,200 injured. Our Chairman Shri Gautam Adani entrusted the Foundation with the responsibility of the education of all the children of the victims' families. Our teams identified 74 families residing in Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha and West Bengal.

Most of the victims were the sole breadwinners of their families, working as daily wage labourers. After coordination with the respective state administration, our teams visited all the families and identified 138 children who were eligible to receive educational support up to high school. Those studying in classes 11 and 12 received one-time financial assistance.

Narmada Flood Relief

Adani Foundation provided timely support to flood victims in the affected villages of Mangleshwar, Nikora and Ankleshwar in Bharuch district. 1000 grocery kits were distributed in 3 villages.



Kattupalli Flood Response

In response to severe flooding in the aftermath of Cyclone Michaung, the Adani Foundation team provided food to 13,400 residents in 10 Gram Panchayats (GP) in Minjur block, Tiruvallur district, Tamil Nadu, by working closely with the District

Administration and Gram Panchayats. A mobile healthcare unit was touring the affected areas to address the community's health concerns and alleviate distress.





Climate Action

Envisioning a better and greener future.

While the world stares at looming threat of climate change evident through rising global temperatures and depletion of natural resources, it becomes imperative to initiate action at all levels. The Adani Foundation has consciously chosen to contribute towards the measures being taken worldwide to ensure a better future for the generations to come. Our vision is to ensure that villages in our areas of operation have no barren area, are self-reliant in terms of water resource and have adequate mechanisms in place for disposal of solid and liquid waste. For this, we are promoting sanitation, green sources of energy, water conservation, climate resilient farming practices, and developing wastelands through organized plantation.

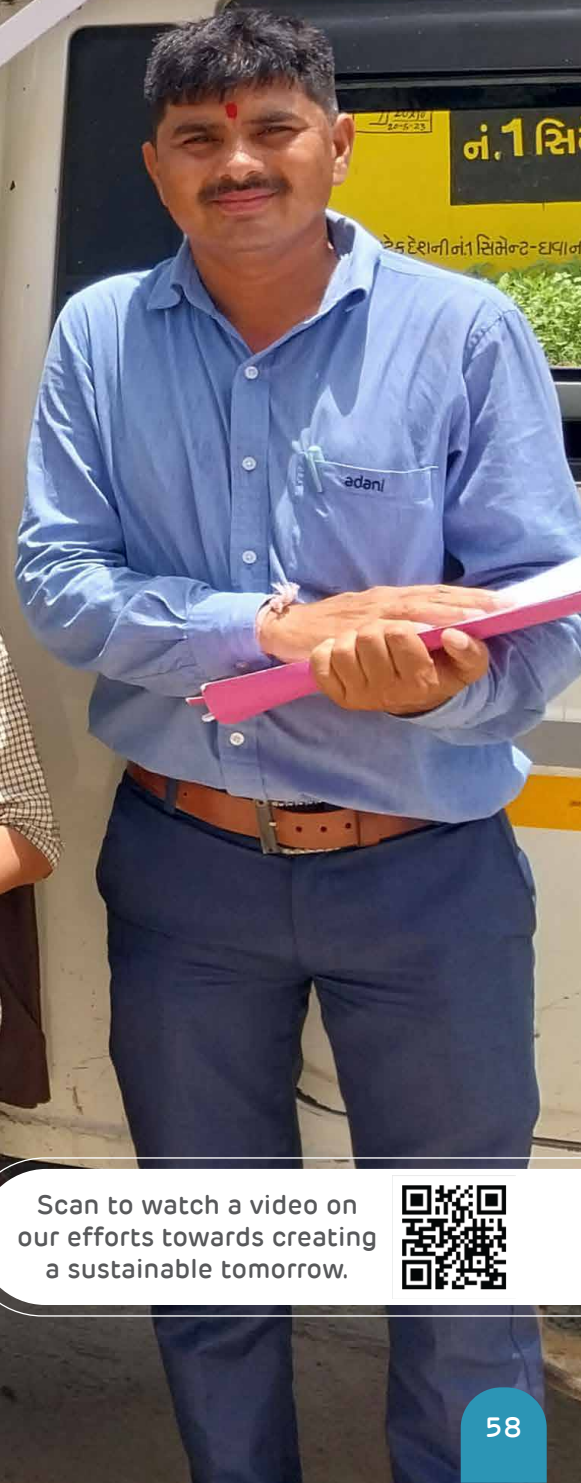

Water Conservation and Management

By collaborating with governmental departments, Gram Panchayats, farmers' groups, and community members, the Foundation facilitates the implementation of highly localised, comprehensive programs, ensuring smooth execution and impactful outcomes. Through construction and revival of ponds, rainwater harvesting and recharge of wells/borewells, the Foundation has increased water storage capacity to **14.53 million cubic metres** till date. This is equal to the yearly drinking water requirement of **99.51 lakh people**.

Water literacy bolstered by sound practices in communities has cultivated good health, good crop as well as immense value, translating well into economic prosperity.

In the year 2023-24, excavation of 92 ponds, 6 check dams, 24 percolation tanks, streams and other activities were undertaken leading to an increase in additional storage capacity by 9,07,531 cubic metres that would benefit nearly 72,400 individuals.

Leveraging Traditional Water Conservation Practices

Rajasthan, particularly Jaisalmer, Barmer, and Bikaner, are among the driest regions in India, where some areas receive as little rain in a year as others do in just a single day. Water scarcity is a constant in these desert areas but the local communities have developed adaptation over time to survive the harsh conditions that involves creating and maintaining the traditional sources of water such as ponds, beris, kuis etc. The Adani Foundation, leveraging traditional knowledge, took

up water conservation activities by being actively involved in rejuvenating the ponds to increase their water accumulation potential. In the year FY 2023-24, a total of 23 ponds were rejuvenated, increasing their storage capacity by 1,47,272 cubic metres. These efforts aim to ensure that surface water lasts longer, recharge groundwater, and benefit the local communities, including around 4,957 families (approximately 28,394 people) and over 1,27,122 animals in the region.



A Holistic Approach to Augment Water Availability

Kutch district in Gujarat is an arid region characterized by severe scarcity of water, long dry spells with usual annual rainfall varying between 350-450mm. The Adani Foundation has made concerted efforts to bridge the gap between availability and demand of water. In the previous year alone, through its initiatives, the Foundation was able to create additional water storage capacity of nearly 2,32,900 cubic metres through initiatives involving repair and desiltation of check dams at 3 locations, construction of 185 rooftop rainwater harvesting structures, 21 percolation wells and excavation of ponds at 13 sites. The recent initiatives have given an impetus to the efforts initiated by the Foundation a few years ago with an aim to address the alarming depletion of groundwater levels and reduction in water sources in various parts of the district.



Engagement and Convergence – a Pathway towards Equity and Prosperity

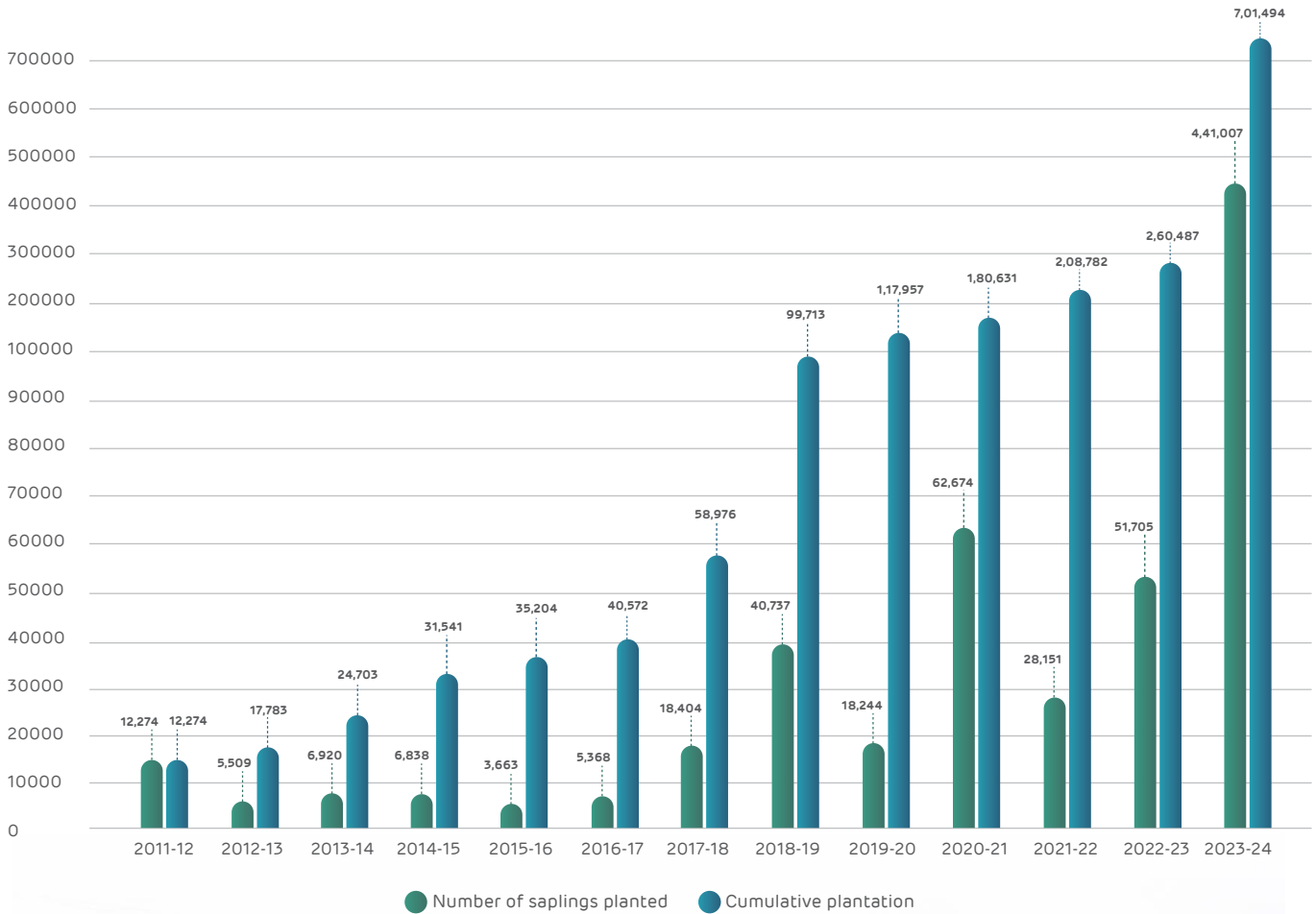
Girish Chauhan is a farmer residing in Mangra village in Kutch with a total landholding of 16 acres. However, cultivation was possible only on 8 acres due to lack of water availability and high salinity. Pre-intervention he only grew garlic. "The Adani Foundation team visited me in 2012 and regular meetings to discuss the wellbeing of the village with them gave me hope. They began by constructing and strengthening check dams, de-silting ponds and constructing canals to diversify the water. The watershed activities have helped in retaining and storing the run-off water which has led to increase in groundwater level". Earlier water was available at 350ft-400ft but after the Foundation's intervention, it is found in 220 ft. Girish and his fellow farmers are diversifying the crops. He now grows bananas in 2 acres, bitter gourd in 1 acre, pointed gourd in 3 acres, eggplant in 1 acre, calabash in 3 acres, bottle gourd in 1 acre, sponge gourd in 1 acre and tomato in 1 acre. He is also able to grow dragon fruit in his farm. "I no longer use chemicals and have been doing organic farming for 3 years now".





Biodiversity Enhancement

Growing trees is one of the best nature-based solutions for removing CO² from the atmosphere and is essential for a healthy planet and healthy people. As part of the Adani Group pledge of planting 100 million trees by 2030, the Adani Foundation has contributed by planting close to 4,41,007 saplings across various locations during the year gone by. The approach is to plant native species that are able to survive in local climatic conditions and enrich biodiversity while creating employment opportunities for local communities in this initiative. The execution entails application of cutting-edge technology for seeding, watering and monitoring, and employs Sustainable Forest Management leading to natural regeneration.





Mass Afforestation in Taranga

The Adani Foundation has taken up the challenge of greening Taranga – a part of Aravalli hills in northern Gujarat spanning 1500 Ha, of which about 400 Ha has the potential to be covered through afforestation. In phase-1 of the project, the development on 50Ha is underway, wherein 1.15 Lakh saplings belonging to 35 types of flora species have been planted. The project integrates multiple world-class technologies including Satellite Based Study / Survey, Satellite Based Regular Monitoring of forest, Plantation & Nutrient Management, Mechanized Irrigation and Drone Technology for precise counting of existing trees before commencement of project to understand the impact of afforestation activity.

Dense Afforestation in the hinterlands of Kutch

The Smriti Van Memorial Park is a unique project to honour the lives lost in the 2001 Bhuj earthquake in Gujarat. It includes an Ecological Park spanning 24 acres of land which was developed by many stakeholders. The Adani Foundation supported the development of 3 acres of land in which 41,000+ trees belonging to 90+ species of trees have been planted using the Miyawaki method. The same afforestation method is used for native species plantation in a 2 acre area at Nana Kapaya village creating a flourishing mini-forest with 5,508 trees. On the same lines, Adani Van has been initiated as a PPP model to develop barren spaces into lush green havens through our massive public plantation drives. In FY 2023-24, 4 such Adani Van were developed by planting 46,000 trees.



Greenmosphere

Greenmosphere is developed as an urban biodiversity park spanning 10 acres in the heart of Ahmedabad, Gujarat. The park embraces a design methodology that combines the Miyawaki forest and emphasizes biological carbon sequestration, boasting an impressive 2.2 lakh trees that contribute to an annual CO₂ equivalent of 3000+ MT and an O₂ equivalent of 1536 MT.



Preserving Coastal Eco-System

The Adani Foundation has undertaken comprehensive efforts to protect and enhance mangrove ecosystems. It has established a multi-species Mangrove Biodiversity Park (13 hectares) at Luni coast in Mundra (Gujarat) in collaboration with the Gujarat Institute of Desert Ecology (GUIDE). In addition, the Foundation accomplished mangrove afforestation by planting 7.42 lakh mangrove saplings across 162 hectares by providing alternative livelihood opportunity to fisherfolk community during the off-season. It is estimated that these mangrove forests have helped carbon sequestration of 58162 tonnes of CO₂.

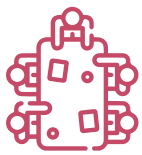
