By promoting inclusive livelihoods and holistic empowerment, Swavlamban aims to create sustainable happiness and break down the barriers that often isolate Divyangs from the rest of society.

This vision is driven by the belief that every person has inherent value and potential. Swavlamban seeks to unlock this potential by providing the necessary support and opportunities for Divyangs to lead fulfilling lives. The project's inclusive approach ensures that no one is left behind, fostering a sense of belonging and community among its beneficiaries.

Laying The Groundwork For Success

The journey of Swavlamban began with thorough planning and preparation. Adani Foundation's team underwent extensive training to understand the challenges faced by Divyangs. This training included insights from the 'Shrimasta Maharishi Ashtavakra community-based Divyang rehabilitation project', which provided valuable knowledge about the daily struggles of the Divyang community.

Additionally, the team participated in training sessions at KCRC, Ahmedabad, where they learned about the various medical categories of disabilities and the relevant government regulations. This comprehensive training equipped the team with the empathy and expertise needed to effectively support Divyangs and bridge the gap between them and the available government resources.

The foundational preparations also involved building a strong network of support within the community. By engaging with local leaders and stakeholders, the team was able to create a collaborative environment that facilitated the successful implementation of the project. This groundwork was crucial in ensuring that the project's initiatives were well-received and effectively addressed the needs of the Divyang community.

Comprehensive Approach To Empowerment

The implementation of Swavlamban has been both strategic and compassionate. The project started with a modest budget dedicated to the well-being of Divyangs. The initial focus was on identifying Divyangs within the Mundra Taluka, which involved close collaboration with local Panchayat bodies. Through these collaborations, the team gathered valuable information and connected with local leaders who were instrumental in locating Divyangs in the region.

Identifying Needs And Building Partnerships

The identification process involved house-to-house visits, during which the team documented the percentage and types of disabilities faced by individuals. This thorough understanding of their unique needs allowed the project to tailor its support effectively. Knowledge of government schemes was crucial in this phase, as it enabled the team to guide beneficiaries through the process of accessing government assistance without raising false expectations.

By working closely with the Panchayat and local leaders, the team was able to build trust within the community. This trust was essential in encouraging Divyangs and their families to participate in the project's initiatives. The collaborative approach also ensured that the project's efforts were aligned with the needs and priorities of the community, leading to more effective and sustainable outcomes.

Fostering Key Relationships For Greater Impact

Building strong relationships with social service officers was another key aspect of the project's implementation. These relationships ensured that the team was well-informed about new government initiatives and could secure the necessary support for large-scale impact. For instance, in 2017, the government introduced the ALIMCO (Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of Indian) scheme, which aimed to provide equipment assessments for Divyangs at the Taluka level. The Adani Foundation's established trust with the Taluka Health Office facilitated the registration of 242 Divyangs, making it the largest registration at the district level.

The project's success in fostering these relationships highlights the importance of collaboration and partnership in achieving meaningful impact. By working together with government officials and other stakeholders, the Swavlamban project was able to leverage additional resources and support, amplifying its reach and effectiveness.



Raising Awareness And Celebrating Achievements

Awareness campaigns have been a cornerstone of the Swavlamban project since 2016. The Adani Foundation has cultivated a strong partnership with the Taluka Health Office, ensuring early notification of health camps and spreading awareness about the necessary documents for those in need. The active participation of the Foundation in these events has led to significant outcomes, such as 90% of Divyangs in Mundra Taluka now holding medical certificates obtained through government camps.



International Divyang Day Celebration

The annual celebration of International Divyang Day is another highlight of the project. Each year, the Foundation organizes events to uplift and support Divyangs. From providing mobility aids like tricycles and wheelchairs to organizing talent hunt competitions and employment fairs, these celebrations have created platforms for Divyangs to showcase their talents and secure sustainable livelihoods. Here's a detailed look at Adani Foundation's initiatives over the years:

2016 & 2017: Enhancing Mobility

In 2016 and 2017, the Adani Foundation concentrated on improving the mobility of Divyangs by providing essential aids. We distributed:

- Tricycles
- Wheelchairs
- Walkers
- Calipers
- Bus I-D cards

These aids significantly enhanced the mobility and independence of many Divyangs, enabling them to navigate their daily lives with greater ease and confidence.















2018 & 2019: Celebrating Talents

Continuing our commitment to support the Divyang community in Mundra Taluka, Adani Foundation expanded its efforts to the district level in 2018 and 2019. A major initiative during these years was the organization of a zonal-level Talent Hunt competition. This event featured captivating folk music and painting activities, providing a platform for Divyangs to showcase their talents. An impressive 675 Divyangs actively participated in this competition, revealing and celebrating their unique abilities.


2020: Adapting to Challenges


Creating Opportunities: The 2023 Employment Divyang Employment Fair

One of the most significant achievements of the Swavlamban project has been the Divyang Employment Fair held in 2023. The preparation for this event involved creating a comprehensive list of Divyangs, contacting them through various NGOs, and filtering candidates based on their age, education, and disability. The Foundation then reached out to different companies, urging them to create job vacancies for Divyangs and participate in the fair.

The employment fair, held at the Adani Field office in Mundra, saw over 250 participants and 22 companies conducting interviews. As a result, 105 Divyangs were successfully shortlisted for jobs in reputable companies, marking a significant milestone for the Adani Foundation and the Swavlamban project.

The success of the employment fair underscores the importance of creating opportunities for Divyangs to participate in the workforce. By facilitating connections between Divyang job seekers and potential employers, the Swavlamban project is helping to break down barriers to employment and promote economic independence among its beneficiaries.

From Hardship to Hope

~The Story of Bharatbhai Makwana

Bharatbhai Makwana, a determined and hardworking individual from a Bhimasar village of Rapar, now residing in Mundra, has overcome significant challenges to achieve a better life for himself and his family. Despite being a 12th pass and suffering from polio, his determination and hard work have led him to a brighter future.

Previously, Bharatbhai worked at a Primary Health Center (PHC) in Kukma, earning Rs. 9,000 per month. Although this job provided some financial support, it left him with little time to pursue further studies. His responsibilities were immense, especially with his father being blind and his mother having passed away.

However, Bharatbhai's life took a positive turn when he attended a job fair organized by the Adani Foundation. There, he secured a position in the Admin CMR department, significantly increasing his monthly income to Rs. 12,500. This new job not only provided him with better financial stability but also allowed him the time to prepare for competitive exams, a dream he had long aspired to achieve.



Reflecting on his journey, Bharatbhai said,

"The Adani Foundation is like a boat in the ocean, saving us from drowning. This opportunity has given me hope and the means to support my family while also pursuing my dreams."

Vinzoda Damyanti Nagshibhai, hailing from Siracha village in Mundra taluka, has shown strength and determination in the face of adversity. Despite a life-changing accident at the age of three that resulted in the loss of her leg, Damyanti has never let her disability define her.

Graduating with a BA in Psychology and currently pursuing her PGDCA from Kachchh University, Damyanti has always been driven by her passion for education and self-improvement. Her journey took a significant turn when she attended a job fair organized by the Adani Foundation. There, she secured a position as a receptionist at Adani Power, earning Rs. 12,000 per month.

""Disability is not a tragedy, ignorance is. Everyone deserves a chance to shine, regardless of their abilities." This job has been a game-changer for Damyanti. It not only provides her with financial independence but also allows her to continue her studies without relying on her father, who is a farmer supporting a middle-class family.

Expressing her gratitude, Damyanti said.

"I am thankful to the Adani Foundation for believing in me and giving me this opportunity. It has enabled me to fulfill my dream of pursuing further studies and becoming self-reliant."

Finding the Right Fit

~Mayursinh's Journey with Adani Foundation's Support

Zala Mayursinh Ghanshyamsinh, from Nani Khakhar, has faced numerous challenges due to his leg disability, which has affected him since birth. Despite these obstacles, Mayursinh completed his 12th grade and earned an ITI certification as a computer operator. However, finding a job that matched his qualifications proved difficult.

Initially, Mayursinh worked at a weighbridge, earning Rs. 10,000 per month. Although this job provided some income, it did not align with his educational background, leaving him unsatisfied and yearning for a more suitable opportunity.

"The right job can transform a life, especially when it aligns with one's skills and passions."

His fortunes changed when he connected with the Adani Foundation and attended a Divyang Fair organized by the foundation. There, he was selected for a position as a computer operator in the gate pass section near the Rangoli gate of the Adani Group. This new role not only matched his qualifications but also significantly increased his earnings to Rs. 21,500 per month.

Expressing his gratitude, Mayursinh said,

"I am immensely thankful to the Adani Foundation for providing me with this opportunity. It has allowed me to secure a job that aligns with my education and skills and has greatly improved my financial stability. This support has been lifechanging, and I am deeply appreciative of the foundation's belief in my potential."

~Rabari Vibhabhai's story

Rabari Vibhabhai Bhachubhai's life took a significant turn when the Adani Foundation organized a job fair specifically for Divyangs. Born in the village of Bhachau and later moving to Mundra, Vibhabhai had always faced the challenges of living with leg polio. Despite completing his 12th grade and earning an ITI certification in computer studies, he often felt that his disability made him a burden to his family.

The job fair was a hope for Vibhabhai. It provided him with an opportunity to showcase his skills and qualifications. His determination and hard work paid off when he was selected for a job in DG House at Mundra Port as a Computer Operator that matched his educational background. This moment was a turning point in his life, filling him with a sense of worth and accomplishment.

Now employed, Vibhabhai is a contributor to the family's income, earning Rs. 12,500 per month—double what he was earning before joining Adani. His job has given him the confidence to continue his studies while working, proving that his disability does not define his capabilities. He often reflects on the words of Helen Keller:

"Although the world is full of suffering, it is also full of the overcoming of it."

Vibhabhai's story is a powerful reminder that with the right opportunities and support, anyone can overcome their challenges and achieve their dreams. His journey from feeling worthless to becoming a valued member of his family and community is truly inspiring.

A New Beginning

Govind Bhai Maheshwari and his wife Gauriben, residents of Mota Kapaya village in Mundra Taluka, have faced numerous challenges throughout their lives. Their journey is a powerful example of how, no matter the circumstances, maintaining a positive attitude can lead to resilience and success. Govindbhai, with only one functioning leg, and Gauriben, lost the vision in one eye, have encountered many struggles. Together, they have raised their 8-year-old son, but their physical limitations often made it difficult to find stable work. Despite their education and willingness to work, opportunities were limited due to their disabilities.

Looking back, Govindbhai recalls the struggles: "Even when we found jobs, they wouldn't last long, and soon we'd be unemployed again. We never stopped trying though, and that's what kept us going."

Their perseverance paid off when they attended a job fair specifically organized for people with disabilities by the Adani Foundation. Despite their limitations, the couple impressed the panel with their skills. The Adani Foundation offered Govindbhai a role as a computer operator at Adani New Industries Limited in Mundra with a salary of Rs. 32,000 per month, while Gauriben, with her background in education, was offered a teaching position at Adani Vidya Mandir in Bhadreshwar for Rs. 19,000 per month. 'It feels like we have finally been given a chance to prove ourselves,' Govindbhai says, smiling with pride and tearful eyes.

This opportunity has brought newfound hope and joy into their lives. With their steady income, they have been able to send their son to a prestigious Englishmedium school, ensuring a bright future for him.

Jeshabhai Bhimabhai Rabari from village of Vandh was born into a life that would soon be marked by extraordinary challenges. At just two months old, a tragic accident left him paralyzed on one side, a condition that even surgery could not fully remedy. Despite this, his spirit remained unbroken.

As he grew older, Jeshabhai sought ways to support himself. He found work as a tractor driver, but his physical limitations led to safety concerns, and he was eventually asked to leave the job. This setback could have been devastating, but his determination only grew stronger.

In his quest for stability, he reached out to the Adani Foundation. Recognizing his potential and drive, the foundation

provided him with a shop near the Adani Solar Company. He began selling tea and snacks, and through sheer hard work and dedication, his business flourished. He soon earned around Rs. 45,000 per month, a significant improvement from his previous struggles.

With his newfound success, he invited his two brothers to join him in the business. Together, they expanded the shop's offerings, increasing their

income and securing a better future for their family. Jeshabhai's journey from adversity to prosperity became inspiration to many.

Brighter Future Against All Odds

In Mota Kapaya village, the Maheshwari family welcomed their first baby boy, Raysi. At age two, polio left 75% of one of his legs paralyzed. When he was seven, his uncle encouraged his father to enroll him in the Disabled School run by Kutch Vikas Trust in Rajanpar village. Though the first few days were tough, Raysi soon connected with his classmates and teachers.

A pivotal moment came when he saw blind students avoiding a pit. Inspired, Raysi realized he could overcome his limitations through hard work. He focused on his studies, completed high school, and began searching for a job. Despite the challenges, he took up smaller jobs, got married, and had two children.

In 2021, Raysi attended Adani Foundation's Divyang Job Fair and secured a job as a Gate Operator at Rangoli Gate, Adani Port, starting at Rs. 13,000, which soon increased to Rs. 18,000 due to his dedication. The foundation also provided him with Divyang medical certificates, a government bus pass, and continuous support. His wife received a wheelchair, making household tasks easier and allowing her to focus on their children's studies.

"When empathy is extended with care, it not only brings joy but also reshapes the future of those it touches."

After three years with Adani Port, Raysi has built his own home and enrolled his children in a good school. Reflecting on his journey, he says,

"The Adani Foundation came into my life like a friend, enabling me to provide for my family. Today, I work with dignity and have the courage to envision a bright future for my children."



From Hardships to Happiness

~Hiruben Karsanbhai Tharu

"Every challenge is an opportunity to discover your inner strength."

In Nani Bhujpur, 35-year-old Hiruben lives with her parents. Her life is a witness to how determination and the right support can overcome even the biggest challenges.

At 1.5 years old, Hiruben was paralyzed by polio. She spent her childhood watching other children play and go to school, feeling confined and dependent on her family. By 23, her father fell too ill to work, and her mother became a laborer to support the family. Hiruben wanted to help but lacked a clear path.

"When you believe in your abilities, the world opens doors to success."

Hiruben heard about a stitching training center started by the Adani Foundation. Encouraged by the foundation, she joined despite her challenges. They provided her with a wheelchair and calipers to

attend classes. After completing the three-month course, she earned her certificate but needed a sewing machine to start earning. The foundation stepped in again, providing her with a sewing machine, a medical certificate, and a bus pass for welfare schemes.

Today, Hiruben runs a home-based boutique, earning around Rs. 10,000 monthly. Her parents, once worried about her future, are now proud of her achievements. Hiruben has become an inspiration in her village, teaching other women stitching and helping them become independent.



Reflecting on her journey, Hiruben says,

"I've learned that disability is not in the body but in the mind. Stitching and the support from the Adani Foundation gave me a new life."

From Temple Duties to Entrepreneur

~Umed's Journey to Independence

Devang Gadhavi, a 24-year-old from Mota Bhadiya village, grew up in a humble farmer's family with his parents and three brothers. Devang was a joyful and mischievous boy, the heart of his family. But when he was just three years old, a tragic accident changed everything. While playing fearlessly, Devang accidentally injured one of his eyes with a sharp stick. His family rushed him to the hospital for treatment. His mother even sold her jewelry, but it was still not enough for the necessary surgery, and, unfortunately, Devang permanently lost 100% of the vision in one eye.

As he grew up, his school life was filled with painful memories. Classmates bullied him, often saying he would never achieve anything. Despite this, Devang didn't lose hope and focused on his studies. He completed an ITI course studying FITTER branch and began studying for a degree in Economics while searching for jobs.

The challenges for Devang did not end there. When he appeared for his first job interview, the experience was heartbreaking; he was rejected because of his vision impairment. This was the first time he felt that his abilities were overshadowed by his disability. He said, "The panel saw my disability, not my education or skills." Disheartened, Devang began to believe he would never achieve his dreams.

Months later, he heard about a job fair for differently abled individuals organized by the Adani Foundation on International Divyang Day. At the interview, he experienced a warm and inclusive environment where his skills and education were recognized. He landed his first job as a Storekeeper at Adani Solar, with a respectable salary of Rs. 20,500.

A year into his job, Devang saw a major transformation in his life. At work, he had opportunities to learn new skills, and he felt respected both at home and in his community. Those who once doubted him now use his story as an example for their children.

Devang says,


